Dear Mr. Meimon:

On September 6, 2001, the Commission received your payment for the 2000 Regulatory Assessment Fee (RAF), plus partial payment of the penalty and interest charges. An explanation concerning the reporting requirements violation. Since you advised me that the address we have on file is the correct address, you should state this in the settlement.



A waiver of objection to the administrative cancellation of the company's certificate in the event its offer is accepted and it fails to comply with the terms which it has offered. If, however, there is a factual dispute as to the manner or level of compliance with any provision in the settlement, Commission staff will bring the matter to the Commission for consideration; and

• Make a specific monetary settlement. There is normally a \$500 fine for each rule violation, or \$1,000 total. However, since you stated your address is correct, I will not recommend a fine for the reporting requirements violation. As information, the Commission has accepted amounts less than the fine amount in other similar cases.

Any settlement offer/correspondence should be addressed to Ms. Blanca Bayó, Director, Division of the Commission Clerk & Administrative Services, Florida Public Service Commission, 2540 Shumard Oak Blvd., Tallahassee, FL 32399-0850. The proposed settlement amount should **not** be paid at this time, instead only the past due regulatory assessment fee, plus penalty and interest charges should be paid. The settlement amount, if approved by the Commission, must be paid within 10 business days after the Commission Order is issued.
