<u>ISSUE 1</u>: Should the Commission find that Florida Power & Light's petition that a waiver of Rule 25-17.0832(4)(e)5, Florida Administrative Code, is unnecessary?

RECOMMENDATION: Yes. FPL's proposed standard offer contract can be processed during its Request for Proposals process. The RFP requested proposals to deliver firm capacity and energy in 2005 and 2006. The standard offer is designed to defer or avoid up to 5 MW's of a 2003 CT at Fort Myers. If a party signs the proposed standard offer contract, the capacity and energy sold to FPL will not significantly affect FPL's need for capacity in 2005 and 2006.

<u>RECOMMENDATION</u>: Yes. FPL's new Standard Offer Contract complies with Rule 25-17.0832, Florida Administrative Code. Thus, the Standard Offer Contract and associated tariffs should be approved.
