By Petition, Global NAPs, Inc. (GNAPs) has requested permission to intervene in this proceeding. GNAPs is a certificated ALEC in Florida. Having reviewed the Petition, it appears that GNAPs' substantial interests may be affected by this proceeding because GNAPs is an ALEC in Florida that provides telecommuncations services. Therefore, the Petition shall be granted. Pursuant to Rule 25-22.039, Florida Administrative Code, GNAPs takes the case as it finds it.

ORDERED by the Florida Public Service Commission that the Petition to Intervene filed by Global NAPs, Inc., be and the same is hereby granted. It is further

Mediation may be available on a case-by-case basis. If mediation is conducted, it does not affect a substantially interested person's right to a hearing.

Any party adversely affected by this order, which is preliminary, procedural or intermediate in nature, may request: (1) reconsideration within 10 days pursuant to Rule 25-22.0376, Florida Administrative Code, if issued by a Prehearing Officer; (2) reconsideration within 15 days pursuant to Rule 25-22.060, Florida Administrative Code, if issued by the Commission; or (3) judicial review by the Florida Supreme Court, in the case of an electric, gas or telephone utility, or the First District Court of Appeal, in the case of a water or wastewater utility. A motion for reconsideration shall be filed with the Director, Division of the Commission Clerk and Administrative Services, in the form prescribed by Rule 25-22.060, Florida Administrative Code. Judicial review of a preliminary, procedural or intermediate ruling or order is available if review of the final action will not provide an adequate remedy. Such review may be requested from the appropriate court, as described above, pursuant to Rule 9.100, Florida Rules of Appellate Procedure.
