In accordance with the Memorandum issued in this docket on October 18, 2002, BellSouth Telecommunications, Inc. ("BellSouth") respectfully submits the following list of proposed issues for consideration in this docket:

1. What market(s) should the Commission consider in deciding whether to grant the relief requested in the FCCA's Complaint?
2. Would granting the relief requested in the FCCA's Complaint increase or decrease investment and competition in the market(s) identified in Issue No. 1?
3. Would it be good public policy to grant the relief requested in the Complaint?
4. Does the Commission have jurisdiction to grant the relief requested in the Complaint?
 - A. Does the Commission have jurisdiction under Florida law to grant the relief requested in the Complaint?
 - B. Does federal law prohibit, preempt, or restrict any authority Commission may have to grant the relief requested in the Complaint?
5. If the Commission has jurisdiction, and if it decides to grant any of the relief requested in the FCCA's Complaint, should the Commission act consistently with its decision in the FDN Arbitration proceedings by:


- A. Ordering BellSouth to continue to provide FastAccess Service to those BellSouth customers who choose to switch their voice provider?
- B. Not prohibiting BellSouth from continuing to provide that service to those customers over a new loop that it installs to serve the end user's premises?
