2. That, as required by Rule 25-22.0406(2), a copy of the Company's petition in this docket was mailed on June 27, 2002 to the chief executive officer of the governing body of each municipality and county within the Company's service areas.

3. That, within 15 days after the Company was notified that the Minimum Filing Requirements had been met (and within 15 days after the time schedule for the case in this docket (the Case Assignment and Scheduling Record)) was mailed to the Company, the Company:


4. That, as required by Rule 25-22.0406(5), within 30 days after the rate case time schedule in this docket was mailed to the Company, the Company:

A. Followed its normal practice in billing its customers in all of its service areas (except the Panama City and Ocala portions of the Company's West Florida Region) for the billing cycles beginning August 8, 2002 and ending September 6, 2002, and enclosed in each customer's bill a Notice of Public Hearings (blue insert) in the form attached hereto as Appendix B (which had previously been approved by the Commission Staff); and


B. Followed its normal practice in billing its customers in the Panama City and Ocala portions of the Company's West Florida Region for the billing cycles beginning August 8, 2002 and ending September 6, 2002, and enclosed in each

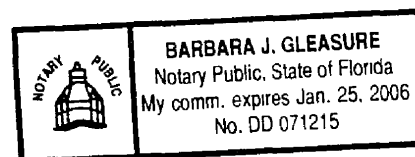
customer's bill a Notice of Public Hearings (green insert) in the form attached hereto as Appendix C (which had previously been approved by the Commission Staff).



RATE CASE SYNOPSIS

On June 27, 2002, Peoples Gas System petitioned the Florida Public Service Commission for an increase in rates. The Commission, under Florida law, regulates rates, charges, and services provided by Florida investor-owned utilities. The case was assigned Docket No. 020384-GU. Peoples' last rate case was filed in January 1992, with a final order being issued in September 1992.

In the 10 years since Peoples' last rate case, many factors have contributed to the necessity for the Company to now seek rate relief. The Consumer Price Index during this period has increased more than 30%, which has not only required that the Company pay more for the goods and services it purchases, but has also contributed to a steady increase in the level of the Company's direct and indirect payroll costs. Additionally, health care costs continue to escalate at a rate significantly higher than that of inflation. During this 10-year period, there have also been major changes in accounting regulations, as well as increases in various taxes, all of which have contributed to the increase in the cost to provide service to our customers. At the same time, the Company has been striving to improve the efficiency and economy of its operations without compromising the level of service rendered to its customers. It is essential that the Company be permitted to recover these costs in order to maintain its financial integrity so that it can raise new capital needed to provide service to the public. The Company has calculated its revenue requirements based on an overall return on rate base of 9.29 percent. The request totals \$22.6 million in increased revenue.

Under the proposed rates (including gas cost and other fees), the residential monthly price of \$27.17 for 20 therms would increase to \$32.12 or 18.2%. In order to more fairly accommodate customers with different volume and usage requirements, the Company is proposing to create several new commercial rate schedules. The small general service monthly price of \$45.35 for 35 therms would increase to \$55.14 or 21.6%; general service (GS) customers with an average usage of 500 therms would be billed on the GS-1 schedule and the monthly price of \$385.90 would increase to \$396.30 or 2.7%; general service large volume (GSLV-1) customers with an average usage of 2,500 therms would be billed on the GS-2 schedule and the monthly price of \$1,794.58 would increase to \$1,814.75 or 1.1%; general service large volume (GSLV-1) customers with an average usage of 7,500 therms would be billed on the GS-3 schedule and the monthly price of \$5,333.73 would decrease to \$5,179.20 or 2.9%; general service large volume (GSLV-1) customers with an average usage of 31,250 therms would be billed on the GS-4 schedule and the monthly price of \$22,144.69 would decrease to \$20,944.69 or 5.4%; general service large volume (GSLV-2) customers with an average usage of 60,000 therms would be billed on the GS-5 schedule and the monthly price of \$38,745.60 would decrease to \$35,182.20 or 9.2%. The monthly bill for a commercial street lighting customer using 1,200 therms would increase \$105.74 or 15.4%; the monthly bill for a natural gas vehicle customer using 3,000 therms would increase \$506.98 or 30.8%; and the monthly bill for a wholesale service customer using 4,000 therms would increase

\$173.00 or 7.1%. Interruptible customers monthly bills would essentially remain unchanged.

In June 1997, Peoples acquired via merger the distribution assets of West Florida Natural Gas Company. Since these customers are currently being billed under the former West Florida rates, the effect of the proposed rates on these customers will be different. For residential service the monthly price of \$26.57 for 20 therms would increase to \$33.24 or 25.1%; commercial service (CS) customers with an average usage of 500 therms would be billed on the GS-1 schedule and the monthly price of \$342.23 would increase to \$399.61 or 16.8%; commercial service (CS) customers with an average usage of 2,500 therms would be billed on the GS-2 schedule and the monthly price of \$1,671.15 would increase to \$1,843.38 or 10.3%; large commercial service (LCS) customers with an average usage of 7,500 therms would be billed on the GS-3 schedule and the monthly price of \$4,762.25 would increase to \$5,184.23 or 8.9%; large commercial service (LCS) customers with an average usage of 31,250 therms would be billed on the GS-4 schedule and the monthly bill would increase \$1,281.25 or 6.5%; firm industrial service (FIS) customers with an average usage of 60,000 therms would be billed on the GS-5 schedule and the monthly bill would increase \$3,148.40 or 9.7%; the monthly bill for interruptible service (IS) customers with an average usage of 200,000 therms would increase \$8,542.00 or 8.8%.

After the filing of the request, which took place on June 27, 2002, the Florida Public Service Commission has eight months to conduct the case. The formal request is circulated to the Commissioners, the Public Service Commission staff, the Office of the Public Counsel, and other parties who express interest in the case.

During the course of the proceeding, Peoples Gas responds to many requests for documents and information.

Service hearings are scheduled to be held in the following cities on the dates and at the times indicated below. Customers of Peoples Gas will be notified at a later date of the locations at which these service hearings are to be held, and such information will also be published in newspapers of general circulation in the Company's service areas.

These hearings enable customers to express their views of the Company's performance, which the Commission takes into account when ruling on the case.

A technical hearing is scheduled to be held in Tallahassee on December 13, 2002. The purpose of this hearing is for presentation by the parties' witnesses of technical prefiled testimony and for cross examination of those witnesses.

Following the technical hearing, the Public Service Commission's Staff, after analyzing all the evidence in the case, will issue a recommendation to the Commission. The Commission then meets to decide the case.

New prices will go into effect 30 days after the Commission's vote establishing the Company's revenue requirements.

More detailed information on the Company's proposed rate increase is contained in exhibits that follow this discussion. A summary of the highlights of the case is set out in Exhibit A, attached, and a bill comparison showing typical monthly bills is contained in Exhibit B. Copies of the complete Minimum Filing Requirements filed with the Commission are available for inspection at each division and regional office of the Company and at the Company headquarters in Tampa.

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With respect to miscellaneous service charges, Peoples has requested an increase in the residential meter turn-on charge from \$25 to \$35, an increase in the residential reconnection charge from \$25 to \$60, and an increase in the residential account opening charge from \$10 to \$20. The commercial meter turn-on charge would increase from \$50 to \$75, the commercial reconnection charge from \$50 to \$100, the commercial account opening charge from \$10 to \$20, the trip charge collection at customer premises from \$10 to \$20, and the charge to a pool manager for dropping a customer for non-payment of a pool manager's bill from \$20 to \$30. Peoples has also proposed three new service charges which include a temporary disconnection charge of \$25, a failed trip charge of \$15, and a credit card use charge equal to 3.5% of each credit card transaction.

The Commission has scheduled service hearings at which the Company will present a brief summary of its case, and the members of the public may present testimony regarding the rates and service of the Company. The dates, times, and locations of those hearings are set forth below. Persons who wish to present testimony are urged to appear at the beginning of the hearing since the hearing may be adjourned early if no witnesses are present to testify.
