ORDER ACKNOWLEDGING NAME CHANGE

BY THE COMMISSION:

By letter dated March 13, 2003, Utility Board of the City of Key West - City Electric System, holder of certificate to provide Alternative Local Exchange Telecommunications (ALEC) service, Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity No. 7697, requested that Certificate No. 7697 be amended to reflect the inclusion of a fictitious name, Utility Board of the City of Key West d/b/a Keys Energy Services. Upon review of the Department of State, Division of Corporations' records, it appears that Utility Board of the City of Key West - City Electric System has properly registered the fictitious name. Accordingly, we find it appropriate to amend Certificate No. 7697 to reflect the new operating name.

This Order will serve as Utility Board of the City of Key West d/b/a Keys Energy Services' amended certificate to provide Alternative Local Exchange Telecommunications (ALEC) service, Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity No. 7697. Utility Board of the City of Key West d/b/a Keys Energy Services should retain this Order as evidence of the name change. We are vested with jurisdiction over this matter pursuant to Section 364.335, Florida Statutes.

Based on the foregoing, it is

ORDERED by the Florida Public Service Commission that the request by Utility Board of the City of Key West - City Electric System to change the name on Certificate No. 7697 from Utility Board of the City of Key West - City Electric System to Utility

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NOTICE OF FURTHER PROCEEDINGS OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

The Florida Public Service Commission is required by Section 120.569(1), Florida Statutes, to notify parties of any administrative hearing or judicial review of Commission orders that is available under Sections 120.57 or 120.68, Florida Statutes, as well as the procedures and time limits that apply. This notice should not be construed to mean all requests for an administrative hearing or judicial review will be granted or result in the relief sought.

Any party adversely affected by the Commission's final action in this matter may request: 1) reconsideration of the decision by filing a motion for reconsideration with the Director, Division of the Commission Clerk and Administrative Services, 2540 Shumard Oak Boulevard, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-0850, within fifteen (15) days of the issuance of this order in the form prescribed by Rule 25-22.060, Florida Administrative Code; or 2) judicial review by the Florida Supreme Court in the case of an electric, gas or telephone utility or the First District Court of Appeal in the case of a water and/or wastewater utility by filing a notice of appeal with the Director, Division of the Commission Clerk and Administrative Services and filing a copy of the notice of appeal and the filing fee with the appropriate court. This filing must be completed within thirty (30) days after the issuance of this order, pursuant to Rule 9.110, Florida Rules of Appellate Procedure. The notice of appeal must be in the form specified in Rule 9.900(a), Florida Rules of Appellate Procedure.
