9	Q:	WHAT IS YOUR NAME AND BUSINESS ADDRESS?
10	A.:	My name is David L. Orr. My business address is 200 Weathersfield
11		Avenue, Altamonte Springs, Florida 32714-4009.
12	Q:	BY WHOM ARE YOU EMPLOYED AND IN WHAT CAPACITY?
13	A:	I am employed by Utilities, Inc., the parent company of Lake Utility Services,
14		Inc. Presently, I serve as Regional Manager and I am responsible for the
15		administration and operation of 35 water and wastewater systems within the
16		counties of Lake, Marion, Orange, and Seminole. The systems vary in size,
17		serving from 39 connections up to over 10,000 connections. All are
18		subsidiaries of Utilities, Inc.
19	Q.:	BRIEFLY DESCRIBE THE NATURE OF THE WORK YOU DO WITH LUSI.
20	A.:	I hold a Bachelor of Science Degree in Environmental Engineering from the
21		University of Central Florida and a Masters of Business Administration
22		(MBA) from the Roy E. Crummer Graduate School of Business at Rollins

College. I am currently certified as an Engineer Intern (EI) in the State of
 Florida.

3 I began my employment with Utilities, Inc. in 1997 as Assistant Operations 4 Manager. In that capacity my responsibilities included evaluating the 5 operation of several systems in Florida, assisting in the assimilation of 6 systems after acquisition, and completing special assignments under the 7 direction of the Vice President, Don Rasmussen. In late 1998, I was 8 promoted to the position of Regional Operations Manager assuming the 9 responsibility of managing the overall operation of four (4) affiliated 10 companies. In March of 2000, I was asked to manage 36 systems within the 11 Lake, Marion, Orange, and Seminole Counties.

12 In June 2001, I left the employment of Utilities, Inc. and was employed by 13 Public Resources Management Group (PRMG), Inc., a financial, rate, and 14 management consulting company located in Maitland, Florida, as a Senior 15 Financial Analyst. In that capacity I was responsible for providing consulting 16 services to municipal, private, and semi-private clients in the disciplines of 17 financial analysis, rate design (impact fees, miscellaneous charges, user rates, 18 etc.), and utility management within the water and wastewater utility industry. 19 In August 2002, I returned to Utilities, Inc. as Regional Manager. Currently, 20 I am responsible for the management of six (6) affiliated companies 21 comprised of thirty-five (35) water and wastewater systems within the 22 counties of Lake, Marion, Orange, and Seminole.

Q:

WHAT IS LAKE UTILITY SERVICES, INC.?

A.: Lake Utility Services, Inc. (LUSI) is a Class A water and wastewater utility
doing business in Lake County, Florida. LUSI is a direct subsidiary of
Utilities, Inc. Utilities, Inc. was formed in 1965 to provide developers with
an alternative method to obtain water and wastewater utility service.
Currently, Utilities, Inc. operates over 400 utility systems in 17 states. We
provide water and/or wastewater services to more than 250,000 customers,
serving primarily residential areas.

9 In March 2001, Nuon, the largest provider of electricity, gas, and water in 10 The Netherlands, announced its plan to acquire Utilities, Inc., which 11 subsequently occurred. Headquartered in Amsterdam, Nuon is the largest 12 energy distributor in The Netherlands, serving more than five million 13 residential and business customers with electricity, gas, and water. In 14 addition, Nuon develops and markets products and services specific to the 15 energy and water industries. Nuon is also a leader in developing renewable 16 "green" energy products such as small-scale hydroelectricity, wind, and solar energy technologies. 17

18 The LUSI system is comprised of thirteen water plants and one wastewater 19 plant. Eleven of the water plants are interconnected serving a rapidly 20 growing area in south Lake County. The remaining two water plants serve 21 two separate and distinct service areas. The Lake Saunders system located 22 near the City of Tavares, serves 44 water customers within a relatively selfcontained subdivision. The Four Lakes system serves 62 water customers,
 again located within a relatively self-contained subdivision. The
 interconnected water system located in south Lake County serves
 approximately 5,812 water customers within a rapidly growing area in south
 Lake County. The wastewater system currently serves approximately 2,003
 wastewater customers.

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Q: PLEASE OUTLINE THE TERRITORY SERVED BY LAKE UTILITY.

8 A: Lake Utility is currently authorized by the Commission to serve 9 approximately 28 square miles in Lake County, Florida through Water 10 Certificates 496W and 534W and Wastewater Certificate 465S. This 11 proceeding was brought before the Commission by LUSI to extend its water 12 and wastewater territory in Lake County by approximately 31 square miles, 13 to include the area marked on the map filed with the application as the proposed service area. 14

15 The existing LUSI service area is a combination of the Lake Utility Services, 16 Inc. water certificate 496W and the Lake Groves Utilities, Inc. water and 17 wastewater certificates 534W and 465S, respectively. In 2002, Lake Groves 18 Utilities, Inc. was merged into Lake Utility Services, Inc. Therefore, the map 19 filed with the Commission as part of the application to extend the service area 20 outlines the existing Lake Utility Services service area, the existing Lake 21 Groves Utilities service area as the service areas existed prior to application 22 for extension, and the proposed service area extension.

1 Q: IS THERE A NEED TO PROVIDE SERVICE TO THE EXTENSION AREA?

A: Yes. Several developers within the requested service area extension have solicited LUSI for water and wastewater service. Also, the Horizon West community development in Orange County is in the construction phase and will extend to the Lake County border, immediately to the east of LUSI's proposed service area extension.

Based upon the current rates of construction and the 5-year historic rate of
connection to the utility, it is estimated that the interconnected LUSI system
will add approximately 4,000 new customers within the next five years. This
estimate is based upon several factors, including the progression of
surrounding development from the northern, western, and southern
boundaries of the proposed service area extension, and a five-year trend of
new construction.

14 Q: WHEN WILL SERVICE BE REQUIRED?

A: Several developers within the requested service area extension have
expressed a desire to proceed immediately with their planned developments,
once water and wastewater have been made available.

18 Q: DOES LUSI HAVE THE FINANCIAL ABILITY TO SERVE THE EXTENSION
19 AREA?

A: Yes. LUSI has expanded its systems continuously over the past three years through the addition of capital improvements to both the water and wastewater systems and has planned on future expenditures based upon the

1		historic growth rates prevalent in the service areas. Currently, LUSI has
2		approximately \$7,138,000 in active construction work in progress.
3		Also, as stated previously, LUSI is a subsidiary of Utilities, Inc., which in
4		turn is a subsidiary of Nuon, the largest provider of electricity, gas, and water
5		in The Netherlands. Utilities, Inc. has a well established history with the
6		Commission since the acquisition of systems within Florida from Southern
7		Gulf Corporation in 1976.
8	Q:	DOES LUSI HAVE THE TECHNICAL ABILITY TO SERVE THE EXTENSION
9		AREA?
10	A:	Yes. Utilities, Inc. has successfully and efficiently provided water and
11		wastewater service to communities since its inception in 1965, and in the
12		State of Florida since 1976. Utilities, Inc. has demonstrated its technical
13		ability repeatedly through numerous additions to its capital infrastructure
14		throughout Utilities, Inc. and its subsidiaries. Also, the management team
15		located within Florida responsible for the management and operation of LUSI
16		has over 116 years combined experience within the water and wastewater
17		utility industry.
18	Q:	DOES LUSI HAVE SUFFICIENT PLANT CAPACITY TO SERVE THE EXTENSION
19		AREA?
20	A:	Yes. LUSI is currently in the process of constructing plant improvements to
21		increase the total combined water system treatment capacity to 8.633 MGD,
22		including one additional supply well. Also, LUSI is currently constructing

1		a one million gallon ground storage tank and booster pump station facility
2		which is scheduled for completion in September, 2003.
3		The wastewater treatment system consists of a 0.500 MGD advanced
4		treatment facility which has been designed to be expanded in phases.
5		Currently, the annual average daily flow to the wastewater treatment facility
6		is approximately 0.310 MGD.
7		LUSI continues to employ a capital improvement strategy which allows the
8		construction of capital infrastructure in a timely, efficient manner. LUSI has
9		planned for the growth within the system, as demonstrated by the
10		expenditures currently in progress and the future phasing of its facilities.
11	Q:	How will LUSI serve these customers?
12	A:	It is anticipated that LUSI will continue to expand its facilities as necessitated
13		by system growth. Currently, LUSI anticipates constructing three additional
14		supply wells, expansion of the Lake Groves WTP by 6.96 million gallons per
15		day (MGD) through three phases, conversion of the booster pump station
16		facility to a 1.008 MGD water treatment facility, construction of the CR 561
17.		water plant, and the expansion of the wastewater treatment facility to provide
18		reclaimed water, all within the next five years.
19		LUSI will serve the additional customers through the systematic, planned
20		expansions to its facilities in a manner congruent to service area growth.
21	Q:	HOW WILL LUSI FINANCE THE NEW CONSTRUCTION?

A: LUSI will finance the new construction through external debt, letters of credit
 and internal funds. Also LUSI can utilize revenues from capacity fees as
 authorized by the Commission.

4 Q: IS THE TERRITORY EXTENSION CONSISTENT WITH LAKE COUNTY'S 5 COMPREHENSIVE PLAN?

It is my belief that the territory extension requested of the Commission in this 6 A: 7 Docket is in substantial compliance with the Lake County Comprehensive Plan with respect to the provision of water, wastewater, and reclaimed water 8 facilities. The territory extension provides facilities to meet anticipated 9 10 demand, maximizes the use of existing facilities, provides water, wastewater and reclaimed water service to a greater portion of Lake County, and meets 11 the required levels of service for water, wastewater, and reclaimed water 12 facilities. 13

14 Q: WILL THE PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO LUSI'S TERRITORY DUPLICATE OR 15 COMPETE WITH ANY OTHER SYSTEM?

A: No. LUSI has already installed the first phase of the core transmission facilities necessary to serve the future development within the proposed service area extension. Currently, the facilities are not duplicative and in fact, most all of the service area extension requested does not border any other utility provider. LUSI has extended its facilities in a manner that does not duplicate service and is applying to the Commission in order to alleviate any future effort to duplicate the facilities already installed by LUSI.

1	Q:	Is it in the public interest for LUSI to be granted an amendment
2		TO CERTIFICATE NOS. 496-W AND 465-S FOR THE EXTENSION AREA?
3	A:	Yes. LUSI has demonstrated its ability to provide water and wastewater
4		service to its present and future customers in Lake County through its
5		experience, the technical and managerial skills and expertise of its personnel,
6		and its financial ability.
7	Q:	DOES THAT CONCLUDE YOUR TESTIMONY IN THIS DOCKET?
