JOINT PETITION OF TAMPA ELECTRIC COMPANY, IMC PHOSPHATES COMPANY AND PROGRESS ENERGY FLORIDA, INC FOR APPROVAL OF THE PROVISION OF ELECTRIC SERVICE BY PROGRESS ENERGY FLORIDA, INC. TO CERTAIN FACILITIES OWNED AND OPERATED BY IMC PHOSPHATES COMPANY IN TAMPA ELECTRIC COMPANY'S COMMISSION-APPROVED SERVICE TERRITORY

IMC Phosphates Company ("IMC"), Tampa Electric Company ("Tampa Electric") and Progress Energy Florida, Inc. ("Progress Energy") (collectively, "Joint Petitioners") hereby jointly request that the Commission review and approve an arrangement made pursuant to the Settlement Agreement ("Settlement Agreement") approved by this Commission in Order No. 02-0929¹ providing for service to IMC Mobile Facilities, as defined in the Settlement Agreement, when such facilities extend across the service territory boundaries established by this Commission between Tampa Electric and Progress Energy. In support of this Petition, Joint Petitioners state:

1. As part of its ongoing site reclamation activities, IMC has installed a 3 mile pumping line originating in the vicinity of its Payne Creek beneficiation plant in Polk County that extends eastward to the site to be reclaimed, which is also located in Polk

County. The pumping line will transport sand from an existing debris field to be used as fill material in an area where mining operations have been completed.

2. The pumping line, which qualifies as a Mobile Facility under the Settlement Agreement, crosses the service territory boundary between Tampa Electric and Progress Energy approximately half way along the north/south boundary between Sections 34 and 35, Township 32S, Range 24E. While approximately 70% of the 7.2 MW load represented by this pumping line is located in Tampa Electric's service territory, Progress Energy's 69KV circuit, sometimes referred to as Switch # 4054, from its District Line Substation is situated in close proximity to the load in question. In order to serve this Mobile Facility from a single supplier of electric power, the Joint Petitioners propose to allow Florida Progress to serve the entire load, including the portion of the load occurring in Tampa Electric's service territory, in accordance with the provisions of the Settlement Agreement. The loads currently associated with this Mobile Facility are set forth in Exhibit A hereto. A map showing the location of the Mobile Facility in question, Switch #4054 and the metering installed by Tampa Electric is attached hereto as Exhibit B.

3. Pursuant to Section 4(d) of the Settlement Agreement approved by this Commission in Decision No. 02-0929:

When Florida Power is providing service to an IMC Mobile Facility that crosses a boundary set forth in the territorial agreement and is partially located in the service territory of Tampa Electric, Florida Power will bill IMC at its then applicable interruptible service rates for the entire load of IMC's Mobile Facility, including the load located in Tampa Electric's service area. Florida Power will remit to Tampa Electric, on a quarterly basis, an amount equal to 50% of Florida Power's base rate revenues, adjusted to reflect its interruptible service billing credit and based on the applicable billing determinants, as set forth in

Attachment A hereto, for all energy recorded on a meter installed by Tampa Electric, at its cost, at a point that isolates and records the energy consumed by that portion of the Mobile Facility located in the service area of Tampa Electric. ...Tampa Electric shall also bill IMC the positive differential, if any, between the applicable interruptible service base rates of Tampa Electric and Florida Power (currently IST-1), adjusted in Florida Power's case to reflect its interruptible service billing credit and based on the applicable billing determinants, from the Commencement Date, as set forth in Attachment A hereto.

4. In accordance with Section 4(d) of the Settlement Agreement, service to the Mobile Facility in question commenced on or about February 1, 2003 and is expected to continue for approximately two years.

5. Tampa Electric has installed metering on the "low side" of an IMC portable substation at a point that captures the entire pumping line load originating in Tampa Electric's service territory within the southwest ¼ of Section 28, Township 32S, Range 24E. The proposed first quarterly billing for the Mobile Facility in question, prepared in accordance with the formula prescribed in Section 4(d) of the Settlement Agreement, is attached hereto as Exhibit C.


WHEREFORE, Joint Petitioners respectfully request that the Commission review and approve the above-described service arrangement in accordance with the terms of the Settlement Agreement.


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
