#### CASE BACKGROUND

<u>ISSUE 1:</u> Should the Commission propose amendments to Rule 25-6.003, Florida Administrative Code, Definitions?

**RECOMMENDATION:** Yes, the Commission should propose the amendments to the rule as shown in the attachment to this recommendation.

**STAFF ANALYSIS:** The purposes of the amendments are to: 1) update the rules to reflect definitions in The Authoritative Dictionary of IEEE Standard Terms, 7<sup>th</sup> Edition, published in 2000 (IEEE Standard 100); 2) revise definitions for clarity and consistency; and, 3) eliminate unnecessary definitions.

The definition of 'point of delivery' was revised so that the definitions of 'service conductors' and 'service entrance conductors' were not needed. Because the terms 'service conductors' and 'service entrance conductors' are not used anywhere in the Chapter, other than Rule 25-6.003, the terms were deleted.

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The term 'customer installation' was deleted because it is not used anywhere in the Chapter.

The Notice of Proposed Rule Development appeared in the May 16, 2003 issue of the Florida Administrative Weekly. A workshop was not requested.

## STATUTORY AUTHORITY:

Sections 350.127(2) and 366.05(1), Florida Statutes, grant the Commission rulemaking authority. The law being implemented is Section 366.05(1), Florida Statutes, which grants the Commission power to prescribed fair and reasonable rates and charges, and standards of quality and measurements.

## STATEMENT OF ESTIMATED REGULATORY COSTS

Regulatory costs are not expected to increase as a result of this rule, so a Statement of Estimated Regulatory Costs is not needed. (This is a preliminary assessment.)

## ISSUE 2: Should this docket be closed?

**RECOMMENDATION:** Yes, if no comments or requests for hearing are filed, the rule as proposed should be filed for adoption with the Secretary of State and the docket should be closed.

STAFF ANALYSIS: Unless comments or requests for hearing are filed, the rule as proposed may be filed for adoption with the Secretary of State without further action by the Commission. The docket may then be closed.
