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

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PROCEEDINGS 1 2 COMMISSIONER BAEZ: We will call the hearing to 3 Is everybody that needs to be here? Okay, great. order. Do 4 we have someone on the connection, Mr. Self? 5 MR. SELF: We were going to, but I understand they 6 are not going to be calling in. COMMISSIONER BAEZ: Okay. Their loss. 7 8 Ms. Christensen, can you read the notice? 9 MS. CHRISTENSEN: Certainly. By notice issued August 10 4th, 2003, this time and place have been set for a prehearing 11 conference in Docket Number 030137-TP, in re: Petition for 12 arbitration of unresolved issues in negotiation of 13 interconnection agreement with BellSouth Telecommunications. Inc. by ITC^DeltaCom Communications, Inc., doing business as 14 15 ITC^DeltaCom. The purpose of this prehearing conference is as 16 set forth in the notice. COMMISSIONER BAEZ: And we'll take appearances. 17 18 MS. WHITE: Nancy White for BellSouth. 19 MR. SELF: Floyd Self on behalf of Messer, Caparello 20 and Self, and appearing for ITC^DeltaCom. I would also like to 21 enter appearances for Nanette Edwards, in-house counsel for 22 ITC^DeltaCom, as well as David Adelman and Charles Jones with 23 the Sutherland and Asbill law firm in Atlanta, also on behalf 24 of ITC^DeltaCom.

COMMISSIONER BAEZ: Okay. Staff.

1	MS. CHRISTENSEN: Patricia Christensen appearing on
2	behalf of the Commission.
3	COMMISSIONER BAEZ: Great. And, Ms. Christensen, I
4	am showing some preliminary matters, confidentiality matters.
5	MS. CHRISTENSEN: Commissioner, there are several
6	confidentiality claims as well as notice of intent that have
7	been filed in this docket. Staff would recommend that those be
8	addressed by separate orders once the request for confidential
9	treatment is filed by the parties.
0	COMMISSIONER BAEZ: Okay. Any objections by the
1	parties? Great.
2	MS. WHITE: (Indicating no.)
.3	COMMISSIONER BAEZ: Great. We will deal with those
.4	under separate order. Are there any preliminary matters that
.5	the parties need to bring to my attention?
.6	MS. WHITE: Two things. One is I would ask whether
.7	we are going to do rebuttal and direct at the same time.
.8	COMMISSIONER BAEZ: We'll take care of that. Mr.
9	Self.
20	MR. SELF: Not as a preliminary matter, no, sir.
21	COMMISSIONER BAEZ: Great. Well, let's take care of
22	that. I mean, is there any objection to taking rebuttal and
23	direct together?
24	MS. CHRISTENSEN: Staff has no objection.
25	COMMISSIONER BAEZ: Okay.

MR. SELF: No objection. 1 2 COMMISSIONER BAEZ: One off table. Ms. White. We are going to go section-by-section on this prehearing order, on the 3 draft. And let's take the first five sections, if there is any 4 5 changes to it that need to be made. None that you can see. All right. Section VI. order of witnesses. 6 7 MR. SELF: I believe. Commissioner Baez, that the order of witnesses there for DeltaCom is how they want it. 8 9 COMMISSIONER BAEZ: Okay. Ms. White, you don't have 10 any changes, you're all right? 11 MS. WHITE: Yes. 12 COMMISSIONER BAEZ: All right. Section VII. basic 13 positions. And we are just going to move through this. If you 14 all have changes to make, you just let me know. 15 MS. CHRISTENSEN: Commissioner, staff would recommend 16 to -- our basic position are outlined in the -- staff's basic 17 position are some notations that several of the issues have been closed and resolved by the parties. I would request to 18 19 delete from the basic position section and deal with that under 20 the stipulation section later in the order. 21 COMMISSIONER BAEZ: Okay. And that will be the 22 second paragraph down? 23 MS. CHRISTENSEN: On Page 9, that would be the first 24 paragraph and the second paragraph. 25 COMMISSIONER BAEZ: Great. Show that deletion. All

1 right. Issues and positions. Issue A: Issue 1A: B: Issue 2. 2 MR. SELF: Commissioner? 3 COMMISSIONER BAEZ: Yes. 4 MR. SELF: I don't really have anything with respect 5 to any of the issues. I mean, I don't need to go through --6 COMMISSIONER BAEZ: If you don't have any, okay. 7 MR. SELF: Right. It is my understanding that there 8 may be a disconnect on a couple of the issues where -- for 9 example, I believe it is Issue 2D, which is on Page 14, 10 DeltaCom has indicated that the issue is closed, there is a 11 position for BellSouth, there may be one or two other issues 12 that don't guite sync up together. 13 COMMISSIONER BAEZ: And I had 2D tabbed. Ms. White. 14 We can take it up now, and I just want to get some 15 clarification from the parties as to who is --16 MS. WHITE: The latest information that I have is 17 that that issue is not closed, so I would think that DeltaCom 18 would need to put a position in there. 19 COMMISSIONER BAEZ: And that is your understanding as 20 well, Mr. Self? Are you prepared to offer a position on that 21 issue? 22 MR. SELF: I do not have an answer to that question. 23 But if we could get a couple of days, and we will either get 24 resolved by agreeing that the issue is closed, or we will get 25 an issue to staff for inclusion in the final version.

1	COMMISSIONER BAEZ: Staff, how soon do you need Mr.
2	Self to provide ITC^DeltaCom's position?
3	MS. CHRISTENSEN: Commissioner, I believe by the end
4	of the week should be sufficient. I don't believe we need to
5	get the draft prehearing order until midweek next week on
6	Wednesday. So I think by Friday should be sufficient. Earlier
7	in the morning, if possible, like before noon.
8	COMMISSIONER BAEZ: Well, the sooner the better, but
9	certainly by morning of Friday, morning of the end of the week.
10	MR. SELF: That's fine with me. And was there one
11	other issue, Patty?
12	MS. WHITE: Issue 8A. 8B is already closed. The
13	latest information I have is that 8A is closed, it has been
14	resolved, too. But I don't know if Mr. Self probably needs
15	to confirm that.
16	COMMISSIONER BAEZ: Can confirm that.
17	MR. SELF: I will do that. And I think with the
18	exception of those two issues, all of the ones that are
19	indicated as disputed are still in dispute. And with that I
20	really don't have anything else with any of the issues. I have
21	given a typo to Ms. Christensen.
22	COMMISSIONER BAEZ: Okay. Great. That's good.
23	That's good. Ms. White, I will offer you the same opportunity.
24	MS. WHITE: No, that's it. I think both parties
25	lacknowledge that we are still talking and we have been very

successful, I think, in getting a lot of issues down to 20 some-odd, and hopefully before the hearing starts we can narrow that down even more.

COMMISSIONER BAEZ: And I wanted to ask one particular question, and it concerns Issue 25. And I guess it is really more for my edification than anything else, but why exactly are we dealing with this issue here? Isn't it part of some -- isn't it part of a generic docket?

MR. SELF: The BellSouth FastAccess case, it is my understanding, is a narrower issue than the issue that is set forth here in the draft prehearing order such that this issue is larger. So that is why this one is still in here. Now, whether the other case resolves some or all of this issue, obviously none of us can answer that today.

COMMISSIONER BAEZ: Okay.

MS. CHRISTENSEN: Commissioner, staff would also like to get some clarification from the parties. There were a number of issues that they had requested deferral on in light of the issuance of the FCC triennial review order, it was not clear whether or not they wanted to defer for the Commission to rule at a future point in time, or if that deferral would, in fact, withdraw the issue from this arbitration to defer it to the triennial review order.

MR. SELF: I think the assumption in the position on those, I believe it is about four issues, was predicated on the

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24 25 assumption that the order would have been out a couple of years ago now. I will need to double-check to see what that deferral really means.

COMMISSIONER BAEZ: Yes. I think we need to clear up what exactly is contemplated. Just from my perspective, just solely or purely on a procedural basis, you know, what exactly are we going to do with them, Ms. Christensen. I leave it to you all to kind of straighten out exactly what is intended.

MS. CHRISTENSEN: What I would recommend, and I guess now is as good a time as any to address it, there are issues that have been closed, there were some issues that were closed before the order establishing procedure was issued, and there have been issues that have been closed subsequent to the order establishing procedure.

My recommendation would be to take those closed issues and indicate in the stipulation section that they have been withdrawn by the parties and indicate the issue numbers. And in regards -- and then delete that from the issue section here altogether so that the only issues that would remain are those issues that are actually in dispute. Not an issue number, nothing. They would just be gone and indicated under the stipulation section.

However, regarding the issues that were going to be deferred until the FCC triennial order. I would go ahead and leave those in with full text with that indication next to

them. And if we can hopefully resolve that prior to the hearing, we can address that as a preliminary matter at the hearing.

COMMISSIONER BAEZ: All right. On the first part of your suggestion, any thoughts from the parties?

MS. WHITE: I'm okay with that, I think, as long as we make it clear that they have been withdrawn from arbitration because they have been settled. I don't want it to be, you know, ten years from now somebody look at it and say, oh, well, DeltaCom just withdrew.

MS. CHRISTENSEN: No, and I had the same concern. That's why if you look --

COMMISSIONER BAEZ: Exactly. There has to be some finality to it.

MS. CHRISTENSEN: I think if you look under the proposed stipulation section, it says the parties have agreed that the following issues have been resolved and are closed and are thus withdrawn from this arbitration. And then we have A, which talks about those issues that were closed prior to the OEP, and then B, which are those issues that were closed subsequent to the OEP, but prior to the issuance of the order establishing procedure, and then just a notation regarding those deferred issues. Although I would still recommend leaving the text of those issues in under the issue section. Because, you know, staff is cognizant that we want some record

of what those issues are, and they will have been clearly 1 2 indicated. The issues are all outlined in the OEP. 3 All the issues that were provided to the Commission 4 are in the OEP, so somebody can be able to go back and look at 5 the order and figure out what specifically those issues addressed. Because we have the same concerns as Ms. White, 6 that once they are withdrawn, that it doesn't reflect on the 7 8 Commission as not having resolved them because they were taken 9 away from the Commission's purview. 10 MS. WHITE: That's fine with BellSouth. 11 COMMISSIONER BAEZ: Mr. Self. You are okay with 12 that. Ms. White? 13 MS. WHITE: Yes. 14 COMMISSIONER BAEZ: Mr. Self. 15 MR. SELF: And I think that is fine, too. And maybe 16 just to clarify, in your very first sentence where it says the 17 parties have agreed that the following issues, you know, maybe 18 you want to say after that, "as identified in the OEP". 19 MS. CHRISTENSEN: That would be a good clarification to put the reader on notice of where they can find the issues, 20 21 and I can add that. 22 MR. SELF: And I think the procedure that she has 23 outlined is acceptable to DeltaCom, as well.

COMMISSIONER BAEZ: Very well. Do we have pending motions other than -- we don't have any pending motions,

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1 correct? 2 MS. CHRISTENSEN: No pending motions. However, there were some minor changes to the exhibit list that staff would 3 4 like to note. COMMISSIONER BAEZ: Let's go back to the exhibit 5 6 list. 7 MS. CHRISTENSEN: Staff notes that ITC^DeltaCom had 8 filed on August 1st a replacement of Exhibit SB-9. I don't 9 know that we need to note it anywhere, but I believe it is the same exhibit that is identified under the exhibit list, I just 10 want to get clarification. 11 MR. SELF: I'm sorry, what was the question? 12 13 MS. CHRISTENSEN: The question was I believe you had 14 filed a replacement exhibit. There was something about it being the wrong exhibit that was attached to the testimony. I 15 16 just want to make sure that we have the right exhibit 17 identified here in the prehearing order. 18 MR. SELF: I will double-check that in this case. 19 MS. CHRISTENSEN: And staff inadvertently left off 20 Mr. Wood's DJW-3, the call summary that is confidential, and we 21 would just note that we are going to add that to the prehearing

COMMISSIONER BAEZ: JW --

order under the rebuttal section.

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MS. CHRISTENSEN: JW-3, it is the cost summary.

COMMISSIONER BAEZ: Right.

MS. CHRISTENSEN: It was identified as confidential. COMMISSIONER BAEZ: Okay. Anything else?

MR. SELF: Commissioner, one matter. It might be an exhibit, it might be a stipulation, so I'm not sure where exactly the discussion would be. And really I guess there is two questions. One is DeltaCom last Friday took the depositions of three BellSouth employees who were nontestifying witnesses. The parties will need to review the transcripts when they become available. There was nothing for you to decide at the moment, but I just wanted to put you and the staff, and I have discussed with Ms. White, on notice that DeltaCom may seek to have those deposition transcripts entered as exhibits in the hearing.

My other question is whether or not the staff is interested, and BellSouth, in whether some of the discovery responses be entered as stipulated exhibits into the record at the hearing.

MS. CHRISTENSEN: I believe that staff can work with DeltaCom in identifying those discovery responses. Generally, staff is amenable to entering as much discovery as we possibly can into the record. So as far as staff is concerned, that would not be a problem. As far as the depositions, I know there have been some preliminary discussions regarding DeltaCom asking or requesting that those be entered. At this point I know of no objection from staff's point of view in having those

1	entered into the record. As far as I'm concerned, we could
2	take care of it as a stipulation today, but I'm not sure that
3	Ms. White would be in a position to answer that question. I'm
4	not exactly sure where we could indicate that as a potential
5	stipulation in the order. I don't know if we need to even
6	address it at all.
7	COMMISSIONER BAEZ: I don't know that it is even
8	appropriate. I mean, I'm not sure that even Mr. Floyd has made
9	up his mind whether it is going to be introduced or not. So
10	let's just call it a developing story.
11	MR. SELF: But I wanted you to know of that
12	possibility.
13	COMMISSIONER BAEZ: Thank you, I appreciate it. Do
14	we have anything else? Ms. White.
15	MS. WHITE: One thing. Under Section 14, the
16	rulings, we understand that opening statements shall not exceed
17	10 minutes per party. I have spoken with Mr. Floyd Mr.
18	Self. Mr. Floyd, Mr. Floyd.  COMMISSIONER BAEZ: What did Mr. Floyd think about
19	COMMISSIONER BAEZ: What did Mr. Floyd think about
20	it?
21	MS. WHITE: Prior to this, and I think we both agreed
22	that we don't need opening statements. So I wanted to if we
23	are going to have to make one, I wanted to know before we left
24	today, and he agreed we did not need to make one.

COMMISSIONER BAEZ: Are we waiving opening

1 statements? 2 MR. SELF: Yes. 3 COMMISSIONER BAEZ: On the record. 4 MS. WHITE: On the record. 5 COMMISSIONER BAEZ: Boy, it makes it worthwhile to --6 MR. SELF: Unless you have this overwhelming burning 7 desire. 8 COMMISSIONER BAEZ: I can only speak as one 9 Commissioner, and opening statements are fine with me if they 10 are waived. And if not, well, it's in the order now, so too bad. 11 12 MR. SELF: The beauty of being the prehearing 13 officer. 14 COMMISSIONER BAEZ: That's right. It's luck of the 15 draw here. 16 MS. CHRISTENSEN: Commissioner, should we go ahead 17 and indicate that the parties have agreed or stipulated to 18 waive opening statements in the stipulation section? 19 COMMISSIONER BAEZ: I don't think any good deed 20 should go unpunished, so absolutely. We don't want them 21 changing their mind at the last minute. Is that all? What are 22 the hearing dates just for --23 MS. CHRISTENSEN: Commissioner, the hearing dates are 24 currently scheduled for September 3rd, 4th, and 5th, as needed, 25 and the parties have assured me that they will at least need

1	two and a half days. I have tried to talk them down to two,
2	but they assure me they will probably need that extra half day.
3	But if they keep working
4	COMMISSIONER BAEZ: Press on, Ms. Christensen.
5	MS. WHITE: It isn't they.
6	MS. CHRISTENSEN: Oh, yes. Mr. Self.
7	MR. SELF: I would
8	COMMISSIONER BAEZ: Now, now, children, please.
9	MR. SELF: I would much rather tell you two and a
10	half days and finish in two than tell you
11	COMMISSIONER BAEZ: Exceed all my expectations.
12	Well, keep at it. If there is nothing else, then this
13	prehearing is concluded. Thank you all for coming.
14	MR. SELF: Thank you.
