Re: BellSouth's May 1, 2003 filing

Dear Mr. Williams:

On May 1, 2003, BellSouth Telecommunications, Inc. ("BellSouth") filed a "Proposal Pursuant to Paragraph 1 & 2 of LPSC Order No. R-26173-A." This proposal was submitted in accordance with the ordering language, which states in pertinent part,

Should BellSouth intend to offer its DSL service over a separate line/loop, it should file a proposal for consideration by the Commission not later than May 1, 2003. Such alternative offering, if proposed, shall not discriminate against that class of voice customers.

BellSouth's initial May 1st and subsequent July 8th filings describe a "standalone" DSL service offering that does not require the end user to have BellSouth voice service. According to BellSouth, this new service will be priced to all customers, including customers with CLEC voice service, in a manner consistent with the pricing of competitive broadband providers in the marketplace. BellSouth proposes to provision this new service on a voiceless exchange line to all customers, including the CLEC UNE-P customer. For the CLEC UNE-P customer, this would mean that BellSouth would not provision its DSL service over the UNE-P line, but rather would provision it over a separate line.

The Commission's Order currently requires BellSouth to continue to provide its retail and wholesale DSL service to customers who switch to CLEC UNE-P voice providers over the UNE-P line. This requirement likewise currently applies to CLEC voice customers who subsequently

choose to receive Bellsouth's wholesale or retail DSL service. The Order permits BellSouth to file a proposal to provision its DSL service over a separate line to CLEC UNE-P voice customers who subsequently choose to receive BellSouth's DSL service, but does not permit such a proposal with respect to existing BellSouth DSL customers who switch to a UNE-P CLEC

In addition to reviewing the May 1, 2003 filing, we have reviewed comments on BellSouth's proposal received May 22, 2003 from AT&T Communications of the South Central States, Inc.; comments received May 27, 2003 from MCI WorldCom; comments received May 30, 2003 from New South Communications Corp. and ITC^Com Communications, Inc. and comments received June 4, 2003 from Access Intergraded Networks, Inc. We likewise reviewed BellSouth's reply of July 8, 2003 to the above listed comments.

Based on our review of the above, the following conclusions were reached. First, to the extent BellSouth's proposal covers existing BellSouth DSL customers, it is overbroad and inconsistent with the Order. Second, to the extent the proposal applies to UNE-P CLEC voice customers who subsequently choose to receive BellSouth's DSL services, BellSouth's arguments in favor of using a separate line, instead of the UNE-P line that is already there, do not persuade Staff that BellSouth should be relieved of its current obligation to provide its DSL service over qualified UNE-P lines. Staff takes no position on how BellSouth chooses to provision its new service to customers other than UNE-P customers.

Finally, we agree that under the clear terms of the Order, BellSouth has pricing flexibility to determine an appropriate rate for its DSL service offerings. As the Commission determined, it "does not regulate the rates or pricing of BellSouth's wholesale or retail DSL service and does not establish any pricing for BellSouth's DSL." However, as also stated in the Order, the Commission retains jurisdiction to investigate any claims of anticompetitive or discriminatory pricing or practices, or violations of the Commission's Regulations for Competition in the Local Telecommunications Market.
