**VERIZON FLORIDA INC.'S REQUEST FOR CONFIDENTIAL  
CLASSIFICATION AND MOTION FOR PROTECTIVE ORDER**

Under Commission Rule 25-22.006, F.A.C., Verizon Florida Inc. (Verizon) seeks confidential classification and a protective order for certain information contained in the Company's responses to Staff's First Set of Interrogatories (specifically, nos. 12, 14, 15, 16 and 41) and Staff's First Request for Production of Documents (specifically, nos. 24 and 25) in this proceeding.

All of the information for which Verizon seeks confidential treatment falls within Florida Statutes section 364.183(3)(e), which defines the term, "proprietary confidential business information," to include "information relating to competitive interests, the disclosure of which would impair the competitive business of the provider of information." If competitors were able to acquire this detailed and sensitive information regarding Verizon, they could more easily develop entry and marketing strategies to ensure success in competing with Verizon. This would afford them an unfair advantage while severely jeopardizing Verizon's competitive position. In a competitive business, any knowledge obtained about a competitor can be used to the detriment of the entity to which it pertains, often in ways that cannot be fully anticipated. This unfair advantage skews the operation of the market, to the ultimate detriment of the telecommunications consumer.

**Response:**

Sprint's proposal for intrastate access is to mirror both the interstate rate structure as well as the interstate rate levels. Sprint's interstate switched transport rate category has sub-element rates for common and dedicated trunk ports, which are not disaggregated from the switched common transport rate elements in their intrastate access tariff. Verizon's proposal does not disaggregate these interstate sub-element rates for common and dedicated trunk ports in the intrastate access tariff, but did utilize the revenues associated with these elements in deriving the interstate average revenue per minute (ARPM). The intrastate access revenue change if Verizon utilized Sprint's methodology would be \$124k additional intrastate access revenue to achieve parity with the interstate access rate. This is calculated by comparing the proposed intrastate access revenue of \*\* REDACTED \*\* to the recalculated intrastate access revenue of \*\* REDACTED \*\* utilizing Sprint's mirroring of the sub-elements mentioned above.

This is an estimated impact only. The quantities for trunk ports are estimates since these rate elements are not in the intrastate access tariff, and were developed utilizing a ratio of interstate trunk ports to interstate end office switching minutes and makes other assumptions in regards to interstate Percent Interstate Usage (PIUs).

13. Were the annualized units used in ODF-3 to calculate the annual revenue changes for residence and business, access lines? If not, please describe the units used in the calculations.

14. What would the revenue adjustments by year be if the PICC were not included in Verizon's calculations?

**Response:**

Verizon's interstate access revenue would be reduced by \$12,898,458 if the PICC was not included. The intrastate access revenue would also be reduced by this amount. Attachment to POD 25 reflects the original ODF-1 adjusted for the audit findings and eliminates the PICC. This leaves the ARPM for traffic sensitive only. This exhibit also shows the recalculated rate design by year, which reflects a 53% reduction for year 1 and year 2 is residually priced. The

revenue impact by not including the PICC in year 1 is a decrease in access revenue of \*\* REDACTED \*\* and \*\* REDACTED \*\* for year 2.
