Regarding our application, dated November 11, 2003, to provide Shared Tenant Service, we provide the following in response to your request for information.

A written explanation of financial capability to provide the requested services.

The proposed geographic area of service consists of a single facility located at 17777 Old Cutler Rd., Miami, FL. A single piece of equipment will be installed to provide DID capability from a trunk line to less than 40 users. All capital expenses for equipment are available and being allocated from a building improvement fund provided by the developer. Only two man-days expense is required for equipment installation, a small fraction of our current operations.

A written explanation of sufficient financial capability to maintain the requested service.

The equipment is low maintenance, requires virtually no periodic maintenance, and only occasional programming to configure customer services: 8 man-hours per month is anticipated, also a small fraction of our current operations.

A written explanation of sufficient financial capability to meet lease or ownership obligations.

The equipment will be installed in a utility space provided by the developer and therefore does not require our company to own or lease space in the facility in order to provide service.
