## AT&T'S REQUEST FOR CONFIDENTIAL TREATMENT

AT&T Communications of the Southern States, LLC ("AT&T"), pursuant to Section 364.183, Florida Statutes, and Rule 25-22.006, Florida Administrative Code, requests confidential treatment of certain data previously filed in these dockets pursuant to a claim for confidentiality. In support of this request, AT&T hereby states:

- 1. Pursuant to the procedure established by this Commission in this docket, AT&T prefiled Rebuttal and Surrebuttal Testimony of Jay Bradbury on January 21, 2004 and February 4, 2004, respectively, for presentation at hearing. Due to the D.C. Circuit Court decision, the March 1, 2004 hearing was convened and prefiled testimony as well as all exhibits were admitted into the record. The conduct of cross-examination and other activities in the proceeding were then held in abeyance. The prefiled Rebuttal testimony of Jay Bradbury included information considered to be and treated as proprietary and confidential, and on January 21, 2004, AT&T filed the appropriate corresponding claim for confidentiality as to those portions of Mr. Bradbury's testimony pursuant to Section 364.183(1), Florida Statutes, and Rule 25-22.006, Florida Administrative Code.
- 2. During the Commission meeting on March 1, 2004, Jay Bradbury's testimony was stipulated into the record pursuant to the parties' stipulation. The

testimony that was admitted contains the information subject to the January 21, 2004 claim of confidentiality. Pursuant to Rule 25-22.006(8)(b), Florida Administrative Code, AT&T requests that the Commission grant confidential treatment to the information contained in the testimony of Jay Bradbury and specifically that information identified as confidential and which appears as follows:

Jay Bradbury – Rebuttal Testimony

Page 23, line 9	AT&T Actual Active On-Net Collocations
Columns 3 and 5	Maximum Calculated Routes Possible (AT&T Proprietary Information)
Page 23, lines 16-17	BellSouth's inaccurate reporting over counts on-net collocations (AT&T Proprietary Information)

The confidential and redacted copies required by Rule 25-22.006(4) are not being filed at this time as they were filed with the claim filed on January 21, 2004.

- 3. All of the information for which confidential treatment is now being requested is considered to be trade secret and proprietary, confidential business information which, if disclosed, would be of benefit to competitors and cause harm to the company and its customers. Such information provides AT&T an economic benefit, and is not known to or readily ascertainable by other persons or parties. Such information is economically valuable to AT&T and its competitors, and AT&T treats such information as confidential and the company utilizes many processes and procedures to maintain its secrecy.
- 4. A trade secret is defined in Section 688.002(4), Florida Statutes, the Uniform Trade Secrets Act, to mean:

. . . Information, including a formula, patter, compilation, program, devise, method, technique, or process that:

(a) Derives independent economic value, actual or potential, from not being generally known to, and not being readily ascertainable by proper means by, other persons who can obtain economic value from its disclosure or use; and

(b) Is the subject to efforts that are reasonable under the circumstances to maintain its secrecy.

The information at issue fits plainly in this definition as set forth above. Accordingly, the Commission should grant the request for confidential treatment and find the information on identified above to be confidential and exempt from Section 119.071(1), Florida Statutes, pursuant to Section 364.183(3)(a).
