CSX TRANSPORTATION'S OBJECTIONS TO STAFF'S FIRST SET OF INTERROGATORIES TO CSXT (NOS. 1-14)

Transportation ("CSXT"), pursuant CSX to the Order Establishing Procedure issued in this docket on December 11, 2003, hereby respectfully submits its objections to the Staff of the Florida Public Service Commission's ("Staff") First Set of Interrogatories to CSXT (Nos. 1-14) which was served on CSXT on May 6, 2004.

GENERAL OBJECTIONS

CSXT objects to Staff's First Set of Interrogatories on the grounds set forth in paragraphs A-C below. Each of CSXT's responses will be subject to and qualified by these general objections.

CSXT objects to any interrogatory that calls for the Α. creation of information as opposed to the reporting of presently CMP existing information as an improper expansion of CSXT's obligations COM CTR ____under the law Staff invokes.

ECR objects to any interrogatory that calls for Β. CSXT GCL information protected by the attorney-client privilege, the work OPC product doctrine, the accountant-client privilege, the trade secret MMS RCA ____privilege, or any other applicable privilege or protection afforded SCR _ , by law, whether such privilege or protection appears at the time DOCUMENT NUMBER-DATE SEC 05617 MAY 143 OTH

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response is first made to these interrogatories or is later determined to be applicable for any reason. CSXT in no way intends to waive any such privilege or protection.

C. CSXT objects to any interrogatory that calls for confidential proprietary business information and/or the compilation of information that is considered confidential proprietary business information.

SPECIFIC OBJECTIONS

CSXT makes the following specific objections to Staff's First Set of Interrogatories. CSXT's specific objections are numbered to correspond with the number of Staff's interrogatories.

1. Given the design parameters of the rail coal receiving facilities, the expected coal shipments for 2004-2008, and normal operation and maintenance expected for such facilities, what amount of annual revenue in demurrage does CSX expect it would have generated from Tampa Electric related to CSX's Bid A if the utility had excepted the bid? Please show all calculations and detail all assumptions.

OBJECTION: CSXT objects to this interrogatory to the extent that it calls for confidential, proprietary business information. CSXT will file a request for confidential treatment concerning any confidential information contained in its response to this

interrogatory. In addition, CSXT will provide its response to this interrogatory to other parties in this docket subject to an appropriate non-disclosure agreement.

3. Do the CSX Bids A and B allow for the use of carrier crews in the unloading of coal at Big Bend or Polk Station? Please explain.

CSXT will file a request for confidential treatment concerning any confidential information contained in its response to this interrogatory. In addition, CSXT will provide its response to this interrogatory to other parties in this docket subject to an appropriate non-disclosure agreement.

4. If the use of carrier crews in the unloading of coal at Big Bend or Polk Station for CSX Bids A and B is presumed, is the use of these crews necessary to support CSX's response to Tampa Electric's Interrogatory No. 37?

Does CSX believe that the transportation rate per ton which could be calculated from the tonnages and revenues included in its response to Tampa Electric's Interrogatory No. 38 were the best estimates of the market rates for delivering coal to Big Bend and Polk Station, via either waterborne or rail transportation, for some or all portion of TECO's solid fuel transportation requirements, without consideration of any terms or conditions it might believe are objectionable within the Tampa Electric RFP? Please explain.

Please describe each instance known to CSX during the period 1994 to present wherein any power plant for which CSX delivered coal, synfuel, or petroleum coke depleted its on site storage supply to such an extent that the plant had to either curtail or cease dispatch of its power generation. In each instance, please indicate the entity responsible for the depletion event and the duration of the curtailment or cessation of dispatch of power generation.

7. Please identify all known locational congestion points that CSX expects could delay or hinder the delivery of solid fuel requirements to Big Bend and Polk Station, and the estimated duration and time of delay, during the 2004 to 2008 time period.

Please describe the location and capacity of the Conrad-Yelvington Distribution facility, the rail and truck miles to both the Big Bend and Polk plants, and the anticipated time period during which CSX would have had to use the facilities to deliver coal per its bid responsive to Tampa Electric's 2003 RFP for coal transportation.

14. What technical and infrastructure limitations or obstacles, besides Big Bend and Polk infrastructure development, would CSX experience in delivering the full requirements of coal transportation specified in Tampa Electric's RFP (5.5 million tons)? Please explain.
