Dear Mr. Potier:

Thank you for your letter dated February 8, 2005, regarding the application filed in the abovereferenced docket. In your letter, you indicated that you object to the transfer and registration of Certificate No. 106-W to provide water service to Silver Oak Subdivision by Raintree Utilities, Inc., 2100 Lake Eustis Drive, Tavares, Florida 32778. You then went on to state that the homeowners had an agreement that water would be provided at no charge and that the well would be a community well.

The Commission's Division of Regulatory Compliance and Consumer Assistance advises that they have never received a single complaint from a customer of Raintree Utilities. Also, in any amendment or transfer application the Commission always investigates and insures that the utility has CMP the financial and technical ability to provide service, and that it owns the land or has continued long-COM term use of the land on which the utility facilities are located. As to competitive quotations, a notice is provided to the municipal and county governing bodies, plus any privately owned utilities in the area. CTR Finally, as to the rates, most residential customers would have 5/8" x 3/4" meters, and would be billed ECR a base charge of \$39 quarterly, or \$13 base rate monthly and \$1.40 per 1,000 gallons used. Therefore, GCL if you have a standard 5/8" x 3/4" meter, and used 10,000 gallons a month, your quarterly bill would be \$81 (or about \$27 a month). Of course, if you have a larger meter, you would be billed the OPC appropriate higher base charge. MMS

presume you have filed your protest in the correct docket, but merely quote the wrong certificate number.

Finally, Mr. Griffin's (or RTG's) relationship with Raintree would not prevent the transfer as requested. Also, if Mr. Griffin (or RTG) is using this transfer to escape his obligations to the original homeowners, this would not be the type of dispute that would come under the jurisdiction of this Commission. Moreover, it would be up to the Department of Environmental Protection and the water management district to determine if this transfer would improperly circumvent environmental regulations or allow Raintree to withdraw any water to which it was not entitled.

Please advise this Commission by March 16, 2005, if you intend to pursue your objection and wish to request a formal hearing. Your request should be made in writing and should be addressed to Blanca Bayó, Director, Division of the Commission Clerk and Administrative Services, Florida Public Service Commission, 2540 Shumard Oak Boulevard, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-0850, and reference Docket No. 050028-WU. If we do not hear from you by March 16, 2005, we will assume that you do not wish to pursue a formal hearing and your letter will be placed in the correspondence side of the docket file in this case for informational purposes.
