Denials by the Number Pooling Administrator for the Jacksonville exchange (Clay

Street)

On March 14, 2005 and on March 16, 2005, BellSouth Telecommunications submitted a numbering resource application to NeuStar for additional numbering resources at their Jacksonville exchange, the Clay Street (JCVLFLCLDS0) switch. Specifically, there are two customers, one requesting (1) consecutive 1,000 number block and one requesting two (2) consecutive number blocks. One customer has requested the specific format of (904) NXX-5XXX, to accommodate a hospital, due to their growth. The other customer requests two blocks in the format of (904) NXX-2, 4, 6, or 7XXX, to assist a company which is expanding and requires numbers for approximately 2,000 new employees. Also on March 14, 2005 and on March 16, 2005, NeuStar denied BellSouth's request for additional numbers, based on the criteria of the FCC's month-to-exhaust (MTE) formula.

On March 29, 2005, BellSouth filed a petition requesting that the Commission overturn
