**FLORIDA POWER & LIGHT COMPANY'S
MOTION FOR TEMPORARY PROTECTIVE ORDER**

Pursuant to Section 366.093(3), Florida Statutes, and Rule 25-22.006(6)(c), Florida Administrative Code, Florida Power & Light Company ("FPL"), hereby moves the Florida Public Service Commission (the "PSC" or the "Commission"), through the Prehearing Officer, for a temporary protective order to exempt from Section 119.07(1), Florida Statutes, certain confidential information in FPL's response to the Office of Public Counsel's ("OPC's") Fourth Set of Interrogatories¹ Nos. 148, 149 and 167 and Fourth Request for Production of Documents Nos. 172, 175, 176 and 200 in connection with FPL's Petition for Rate Increase, and in support states:

1. OPC has requested that it be permitted to inspect and potentially take possession of certain of FPL's confidential, proprietary business information in FPL's responses to OPC's Fourth Set of Interrogatories Nos. 148, 149 and 167 and Fourth Request for Production of Documents Nos. 172, 175, 176 and 200 in Docket No. 050045-EI.

2. Subsection (6)(c) of the Commission's confidentiality rule, 25-22.006, provides in relevant part as follows with respect to a utility allowing OPC to take possession of utility information:

¹ OPC's Interrogatory Nos. 148, 149 and 167, which contain confidential information, are in fact requests for production of documents and have been treated as such for purposes of responding.

[T]he utility may request a temporary protective order exempting the information from Section 119.07(1), Florida Statutes. If the information is to be used in a proceeding before the Commission, then the utility must file a specific request for a protective order under paragraph (a) above. If the information is not to be used in a proceeding before the Commission, then Public Counsel shall return the information to the utility in accordance with the record retention requirements of the Department of State.

See Rule 25-22.006(6)(c).

3. FPL respectfully requests that the Commission enter a temporary protective order affording FPL the protection that is needed to provide OPC the confidential information in FPL's responses to OPC's Fourth Set of Interrogatories Nos. 148, 149 and 167 and Fourth Set of Requests for Production of Documents Nos. 172, 175, 176 and 200.

4. FPL has been authorized by counsel for OPC to represent that OPC does not object to the granting of this motion.

WHEREFORE, for the foregoing reasons, FPL respectfully requests that the Commission enter a temporary protective order protecting against public disclosure the confidential information in FPL's responses to OPC's Fourth Set of Interrogatories Nos. 148, 149 and 167 and Fourth Set of Requests for Production of Documents Nos. 172, 175, 176 and 200 in connection with FPL's Petition for Rate Increase.
