Dear Mr. Friedman:

We have reviewed the minimum filing requirements (MFRs) submitted on August 8, 2005, on behalf of Plantation Bay Utility Company (Plantation Bay or utility). After reviewing this information, we find the MFRs to be deficient. The specific deficiencies are identified below:

Rule 25-30.020(2)(e), Florida Administrative Code (FAC), requires the utility to

submit a filing fee for file and suspend rate cases based on the existing capacity to serve.

	Subsection 5, indicates that for utilities with existing capacity to service from 2,001 to
	4,000 ERCs, the filing fee shall be \$3,500. Pursuant to Plantation Bay's water system
CMP	capacity of 750,000 gallons per day, the utility has an existing capacity to serve 2,143.
COM	Therefore, the utility's appropriate filing fee should be \$3,500 for its water system.

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4. If any above corrections require a corresponding change to any MFR schedules, those corrected schedules must also be submitted.

Your petition will not be deemed filed until the deficiencies identified in this letter have been corrected. These corrections should be submitted no later than September 19, 2005.
