On September 22, 2005, SBC Long Distance LLC, d/b/a SBC Long Distance, submitted an application to NeuStar, the Number Pooling Administrator (PA), for additional numbering resources in the Boynton Beach (PMBHFL99DS0), Clearwater (TAMTFLTWDS0), Miami (MIAUFLJODS0), North Dade (MIAUFLJODS0), Orlando (ORLFFLYLDS0), Sanford (ORLFFLYLDS0), and West Palm Beach (PMBHFL99DS0) rate centers. SBC Long Distance specifically requested one (1) 1,000 block in each of the seven rate centers, to meet a customer's request for numbers to be used for Direct Inward Dialing, (DID). Also on September 22, 2005, the PA denied the SBC Long Distance application because it did not meet the months-to-exhaust utilization criteria required for new blocks of numbers.

On September 28, 2005, SBC Long Distance filed a petition requesting that the Commission overturn the PA's decision to deny numbering resources for the Boynton Beach, Clearwater, Miami, North Dade, Orlando, Sanford, and West Palm Beach rate centers. In accordance with Commission Order PSC-02-0352-PAA-TL, (Docket No. 020087-TL) which approved an expedited process for the PA code denials, we have examined the SBC Long Distance petition and have determined the following:

- 1) The carrier has demonstrated that it has a customer in need of numbering resources;
- 2) The carrier has shown that it is unable to provide services to this potential customer because of NeuStar's denial of the numbering resources; and
- 3) The customer will not be able to obtain service from the provider of his/her choice because the carrier does not have the numbers available.

Since the three criteria of PSC-02-0352-PAA-TL have been met, please prepare an administrative Proposed Agency Action Order to be issued within seven business days of this memorandum (October 18, 2005), as outlined in the expedited code denial process orders. The PA should be directed to provide SBC Long Distance the needed numbering resources to meet its customer's needs in the Boynton Beach, Clearwater, Miami, North Dade, Orlando, Sanford,

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and West Palm Beach rate centers. Also, please allow staff assigned to the docket to review the Order before it is issued. If you have any questions, please call Catherine Beard at (850)413-7080.
