## MOTION FOR ADDITIONAL TIME TO COMPLY WITH ORDER ON GULF POWER'S MOTION TO RECONSIDER

Gulf Power Company ("Gulf Power"), pursuant to the Presiding Judge's October 12.

September 30, 2005, Gulf Power filed its Motion to Reconsider Limited Portions of Second Discovery Order, arguing that this portion of the Second Discovery Order called for the creation of a new document, which Gulf Power was not required to produce. (Motion to Reconsider, p. 5).

- 2. On October 12, 2005, the Presiding Judge issued an Order, requiring Gulf Power to proceed with a non-binding production of documents responsive to complainants' Request No. 15 in the manner prescribed by the Second Discovery Order. The October 12, 2005 Order also advised that the Presiding Judge would consider "any reasonable request for additional time to comply" with the ruling. (October 12, 2005 Order, p. 4).
- 3. Gulf Power believes that a December 16, 2005 deadline would allow sufficient time to respond to Request No. 15 in the manner prescribed by the Presiding Judge. Given the upcoming depositions scheduled for the week of November 14-18, 2005, and the Thanksgiving holiday, Gulf Power believes that December 16, 2005 is a sensible deadline that takes the schedules of all parties into account.
- 4. Gulf Power respectfully requests that the Presiding Judge enter an order setting December 16, 2005 as the deadline for Gulf Power's non-binding response to complainants' Request No. 15.
