The U. S. Fish and Wildlife Service (Service) reviewed the Final Draft of the "Florida Public Services Commission's Staff Recommendations to the Commission Internal Affairs, System Hardening" and would like to offer the following comments:

The Florida manatee has come to depend upon Florida's power plants as a place of refuge during the winter. The power plant discharges provide about 2/3 of Florida's population of this endangered species with essential habitat, habitat without which they will survive.

While the hurricane season is generally over well in advance of the winter season, the long-term loss of power plant operations due to a hurricane seriously crippling a power plant could have a significant, catastrophic, effect on manatees known to use these sites. In the absence of warm water from power plants disabled by hurricanes, manatees will be exposed to cold weather extremes and may die as a result of this exposure. A contingency plan is needed to ensure that steps are in place to protect manatees from the loss of warm water.

In addition to the loss of warm water, manatees may be affected by hurricanes through other venues. Studies are currently taking place to assess the effect of hurricanes on manatees. One study has identified hurricane-related decreases in survival rates and another study seeks to assess the effect of hurricane-related fuel spills on manatees. Both studies are important to assessing manatee response to hurricanes and our ability to respond to these events. While human safety is of paramount concern in regard to hurricanes, the protection of endangered species such as the manatee from these events is also a sensitive issue. The Service recommends, therefore, that system hardening plans include measures to assess and protect manatees dependent upon the continued operation of Florida's power plants.
