The Department has completed its review of the Gold Coast Utility Corporation's application to the Public Service Commission to amend Water Certificate No. 590-W and Wastewater Certificate No. 508-S to expand the utility's service area in Polk County. A copy of our staff memorandum is enclosed for your review.

We have identified urban sprawl as an issue of concern. Future Land Use Policy 2.102-

	A10, in the Polk County Comprehensive Plan, "discourages the proliferation of urban sprawl" through the application of the criteria listed in the policy to "determine the appropriateness of

COM	the policy to the Gold Coast Utility application, the proposed expansion of the service area

The proposed application for the expansion of the water and wastewater service area for the Gold Coast Utility Corporation did not include any data and analysis to demonstrate that the proposed service area expansion was needed to meet approved development. Nor was information provided to indicate that the anticipated development is needed to meet projected growth demands in the area and that existing development opportunities are unavailable to meet that anticipated growth. In the absence of this data and analysis, the expanded service area will promote urban sprawl by expanding an isolated urban sprawl enclave.

To address the urban sprawl issue, the applicant should include additional information to demonstrate there is a need for the anticipated development in the area where the service area expansion is proposed and include data and analysis to demonstrate that there is insufficient vacant land to meet the projected demand. Additional data and analysis should be provided to explain how the urban sprawl indicators discussed above would be overcome. Rule 9J-5.006(5)(j), F.A.C., includes development controls that can be employed to address urban sprawl issues. The applicant should coordinate with the Polk County Growth Management Department to resolve these urban sprawl issues.
