VERIZON ACCESS TRANSMISSION SERVICES' PREHEARING STATEMENT

In accordance with Order No. PSC-05-0927-PCO-TP (Order Establishing Procedure), as modified by Order Nos. PSC-05-1212-PCO-TP and PSC-05-1264-PCO-TP, MCImetro Access Transmission Services LLC d/b/a Verizon Access Transmission Services ("Verizon Access") hereby files this Prehearing Statement.

(a) Witnesses

Verizon Access has pre-filed the Supplemental Testimony of Don Price, which addresses the outstanding issues: Issues 12, 26 and 34. In addition, on Issue 12, Mr. Price will adopt the Direct Testimony of Greg Darnell at p. 32, line 5 through p. 33 line 9, and the Rebuttal Testimony of Greg Darnell at p. 22, line 18 through p. 24 line 21. On Issue 34, Mr. Price will adopt the Direct Testimony of Greg Darnell at p. 50, line 11 through p. 52, line 8, and the Rebuttal Testimony of Greg Darnell at p. 28, line 12 through p. 30, line 11.

VERIZON ACCESS: BellSouth is obligated to act as a transit carrier because the parties have agreed to language requiring it to perform that function. The parties have attempted to negotiate a transit rate, but have been unable to agree, so determination of a rate by the Commission is required. Because BellSouth has not justified the transit rate it proposes to charge, the existing rate should remain in place.

<u>VERIZON ACCESS</u>: The principal dispute is whether, if Verizon Access fails to pay a bill for a BellSouth service, BellSouth may suspend, discontinue or terminate all services it provides to Verizon Access regionwide. BellSouth's proposed language that would permit it to take this action is unreasonable because it could result in all services to Verizon Access being suspended, discontinued or terminated in all BellSouth states because a small bill for a minor service in one state was mistakenly not paid.
