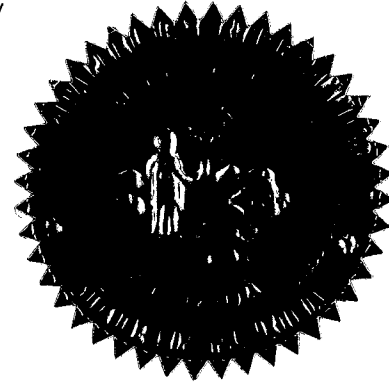

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P R O C E E D I N G S

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CHAIRMAN EDGAR: We will move on and take up Item 15.

MS. DRAPER: Commissioners, this is Elizabeth Draper on behalf of the Commission Staff.

Item 15 deals with FPL's petition to extend the notice customers who take service under FPL's curtailable service must give to FPL to return to a firm rate schedule from one year to three years.

Staff and FPL are here to answer any questions.

CHAIRMAN EDGAR: Thank you.

COMMISSIONER DEASON: I have a question for staff.

CHAIRMAN EDGAR: Commissioner Deason.

COMMISSIONER DEASON: Let me, first of all, say that I agree with the recommendation. I think it's a move in the right direction. I just wanted to confirm one thing, which I think is the case, and maybe staff can do this. The fact that we're going to a three-year termination notice, and that just so happens to coincide with the 36-month period normally associated with adding capacity associated with combined cycle technology, is no indication that there is a preference for that type of technology and that this is not going to hamper planning for other types of base load generation such as coal and nuclear, is that correct?

MR. COLSON: I wouldn't think it would. But in terms of what type of customers these are, you know, you would leave

1 all generation on the table. You're not going to pull any
2 generation off. Because, you know, you have peaker type of
3 generation that you want to plan for as well as coal capacity
4 or any other type capacity.

5 COMMISSIONER DEASON: So this doesn't have any
6 effect -- it leaves all options on the table as far as adding
7 new generation?

8 MR. COLSON: Yes.

9 COMMISSIONER DEASON: Does FPL agree with that
10 assessment?

11 MS. SMITH: Yes, sir.

12 CHAIRMAN EDGAR: Commissioners, any further questions
13 on this item? No.

14 COMMISSIONER CARTER: Move staff.

15 COMMISSIONER DEASON: Second.

16 CHAIRMAN EDGAR: We have a motion and a second in
17 favor of the staff recommendation for Item 15.

18 All in favor say aye.

19 (Unanimous affirmative vote.)
