

Dear Mr. And Mrs. Zila:

Thank you for your December 30, 2003 letter in which you expressed concern that a rate reduction for customers of Residential Water Systems, Inc. would affect the quality of service you receive and that a common sense approach is not being used regarding this issue. Let me take this opportunity to briefly explain how the Florida Public Service Commission establishes rates. Pursuant to Section 367.081, Florida Statutes, the Commission shall set rates which are just, reasonable, compensatory, and are not unfairly discriminatory.

In determining the revenue requirements for the water and wastewater services, the Commission employs the rate of return methodology established in Chapter 367, Florida Statutes. Using this methodology, the Commission sets a range on the utility's investment used and useful in the customer service, and sets rates accordingly. If the utility appears to be earning greater than this authorized range, it is the duty of the Commission to investigate and take actions that will protect the public health, safety, and welfare.

This ratemaking process is used for all water and wastewater companies and is also used in the electric and gas industry. It is the same approach used throughout the country by various state and federal utility regulatory bodies.

There are many factors that affect the cost of providing service and, hence, the rates charged to customers. Some of the factors affecting the cost of providing service include the size and age of the utility system, the number of customers, the geographic spread of the service area, and the location of the plant in an environmentally sensitive area. During an investigation, the Commission's accountants, engineers and economists examine the financial and engineering information provided by companies. The Commission's auditors also examine this information and publish the results of their findings in an audit report. Recovery of any costs found by the Commission to be imprudent or unreasonable is not allowed. Once the revenue requirement is set,

the Commission must then establish service rates which will afford the utility the opportunity to earn the approved revenue requirement.

The setting of rates is prescribed by the Florida Statutes and the Florida Administrative Code (F.A.C.). Therefore, the Public Service Commission is required to set rates in accordance with the law and the rules. As described above, rates are designed to cover the cost to provide service plus a return on the owner's investment. Thus, the utility's quality of service should not be affected since revenues (rates) will be set to recover both a return on the utility's investment and its prudently incurred expenses .

Pursuant to Chapter 403, Part IV, Florida Statutes, and by delegation of the federal program from the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, the Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) has the primary role of regulating public water systems in Florida. The DEP enforces Florida's drinking water standards contained in Chapter 62-550, F.A.C. The primary drinking water standards, which are health based, are described in Rule 62-550.310, F.A.C., and specific numeric limits are listed in a series of tables contained in this chapter. Section 403.851, Florida Statutes, specifically states, "It is the policy of the state that the citizens of Florida shall be assured of the availability of safe drinking water."

In addition to the rules that DEP enforces, the Public Service Commission also enforces its own rules concerning water and wastewater service. Rule 25-30.225(2), F.A.C., states, "Each utility shall maintain and operate its plant and facilities by employing qualified operators in accordance with the rules of the Department of Environmental Protection." Rule 25-30.225(5), F.A.C., also states:

Each water utility shall operate and maintain in safe, efficient, and proper condition, all of its facilities and equipment used to distribute, regulate, measure or deliver service up to and including the point of delivery into the piping owned by the customer.

Finally, Rule 25-30.225(9), F.A.C., also states:

Each utility shall inspect its plant and facilities in such a manner and with such frequency as may be necessary to ensure that the plant and facilities are maintained in proper condition for rendering safe and adequate service.

So, please be assured that Residential Water Systems, Inc., must abide by all applicable rules and statutes concerning the quality of service provided to its customers. Also, please be assured that the Commission will do everything it can to protect and promote the public interest.


