# **AARP PETITION TO INTERVENE**

Pursuant to Sections 120.569 and 120.57(1), Florida Statutes and Rules 25-22.039, and 28-106.205, Florida Administrative Code, the AARP, through its undersigned attorney, files its Petition to Intervene, and in support thereof, states as follows:

- 4. Progress Energy Florida, Inc. ("PEF") is a regulated electric utility serving approximately 1.6 million retail customers throughout portions of the State of Florida.
- 5. AARP is a nonprofit membership organization dedicated to addressing the needs and interests of persons 50 and older. AARP has staffed offices in all 50 states, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico and the U.S. Virgin Islands. AARP represents more than 35 million members in total, approximately 2.8 million of whom reside in the State of Florida. AARP's Florida members reside throughout the state and a significant number of them are retail residential customers of PEF.

## AARP Florida Members' Substantial Interests Affected

6. As stated above, AARP has approximately 2.8 million members in the State of Florida, a significant number of whom reside in PEF's service territory and take their electric service from the utility. Therefore, many of AARP's members will be substantially affected by any action the Commission takes in this docket, which will necessarily include retail rate increases through the utility's fuel adjustment charges if its requested relief is granted.

#### 7. Statement of Affected Interests

The Commission will decide in this docket whether to approve PEF's request, among the other relief requested, to recover the costs of it upgrading its Crystal River No. 3 nuclear generating unit through the Fuel and Purchased Power Cost Recovery Clause ("Fuel Clause") as proposed. According to its petition filed in this docket, PEF states that the "estimated cost of the power uprate itself is approximately \$250 million." AARP takes the position that it is legally inappropriate to attempt to recover the capital costs of power plant additions through the Fuel Clause, whether new construction or plant upgrades. Furthermore, AARP assumes that the \$250

million cited by PEF is the minimum amount that PEF will attempt to recover from AARP's members served by the utility and its other retail customers through the Fuel Clause.

8. AARP's members taking retail electric service from PEF have interests of the type this proceeding is designed to protect. See Agrico Chemical Company v. Department of Environmental Regulation, 406 So.2d 478 (Fla. 2<sup>nd</sup> DCA 1981). The purpose of the proceeding is to evaluate PEF's request and to review the nature of its costs and expenditures to determine if any such costs are appropriate for recovery as requested. These issues will affect AARP's PEF customer members' substantial interests by potentially increasing their costs of electricity, which necessarily will reduce their monies available for other purposes.

# 9. <u>Disputed Issues of Material Fact</u>

Whether the costs projected by PEF for the CR 3 upgrade are reasonable and prudent for the project as described.

# 10. Disputed Legal Issues

Whether it is legally permissible for PEF to request, and the Commission to allow, the utility to recover the capital costs associated with the CR 3 upgrade through the Fuel Clause, as opposed to through its base rates. Furthermore, whether this attempt to recover the capital costs associated with this power plant upgrade is contrary to the current rate case settlement agreement with AARP and its other customer groups whereby the utility has committed to not increase its base rates until after the expiration of the settlement agreement in 2009.

#### 11. Statement of Ultimate Facts Alleged

PEF is attempting to circumvent its current settlement agreement with AARP and its

other customer groups by seeking to recover the capital costs associated with the proposed CR 3 upgrade through its Fuel Clause, as opposed to recovering those costs through its base rates.

WHEREFORE, AARP requests that this Commission grant it intervenor status in this docket as a full party on behalf of the significant number of its approximately 2.8 million Florida members taking retail electric service from Progress Energy Florida, Inc.
