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PROCEEDINGS

COMMISSIONER CARTER: Good morning. My name is Matthew Carter, a Public Service Commissioner, and I want to welcome you all here. Good morning, everyone.

First of all, I'll introduce my distinguished colleague Commissioner Katrina Tew, and let you know that we're here this morning. I'd call the meeting to order.

Mr. Fudge, would you read the notice, please?

MR. FUDGE: By notice issued October 18th, 2006, this time and place was set for a customer hearing in Docket Number 060644. The purpose is as set forth in the notice.

COMMISSIONER CARTER: Okay. Thank you, Mr. Fudge. Is it -- if we can go ahead on and take appearances now.

MS. MASTERTON: Good morning, Commissioners. Susan Masterton representing Embarq. And with me here today I have our vice president for the state, Charles Rehwinkel, and Sandy Khazraee, our regulatory manager, and Joyce Sanders, who is our local public affairs manager. We're just here today to listen and to answer any questions that might come up.

COMMISSIONER CARTER: Thank you.

MR. McLEAN: I'll be happy to go next. My name is Harold McLean, Office of Public Counsel. I'm the Public Counsel on behalf of the citizens of the State of Florida. Address, 111 West Madison, Tallahassee, 32399.

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COMMISSIONER CARTER: Ms. Salak.

MS. SALAK: I'm Beth Salak. I'm with Commission staff also.

COMMISSIONER CARTER: Thank you very much. I want to welcome all of you here to this hearing this morning, this hearing, and I appreciate your appearance here, I appreciate your presence, and I want to hear from any members of the community that want to be heard today. It's an official meeting that will be transcribed and be part of the official record. We have a court reporter here, so such that anyone wishing to speak today will be sworn in, and we'll take care of that in a few minutes. Their comments will be subject to cross-examination.

Before we get to that, I'd like to introduce our PSC staff who are here to help with any questions. First,

Mr. Rick Moses and also Ms. Thelma Crump would be willing to help you. Also, Embarq brought staff here to assist.

MS. MASTERTON: Yeah. I think -- right.

Ms. Khazraee.

COMMISSIONER CARTER: Just raise your hand. There you go.

You may have noticed speaker sign-up forms.

Ms. Crump has those back there. Anyone wishing to speak,

please complete the form, sign those up. You may not want to

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speak today. You may want to send your comments in in writing.

Take the blue form here and you will complete that and just

mail it in to us at the address supplied here.

Before asking for any comments, Mr. McLean, do we have anyone signed up?

MR. McLEAN: No, sir, I don't.

COMMISSIONER CARTER: Why don't we do this, Madam

Commissioner, if it's okay with you. We'll just dispense -we'll just go in recess. And if anyone shows up, then we'll go
through the formalized process. Is that okay with you, Mr.

McLean?

MR. McLEAN: Yes, sir. No one has contacted me or approached me about testifying today as yet. So that procedure is fine with me.

COMMISSIONER CARTER: Then let's consider ourselves in recess.

(Recess taken.)

COMMISSIONER CARTER: Go back on the record. In view of the fact that we have a consumer that would like to speak today, let's just kind of -- I want to get back on the record and just say that I'd like the attorneys for the parties to make an opening statement beginning with Embarq. You are recognized.

MS. MASTERTON: Thank you, Commissioners.

I haven't really prepared a lengthy opening FLORIDA PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION

statement. Embarq understands this is a public hearing to get comments from the public about our petition to recover the costs to repair our facilities in the 2005 hurricane season. We've come to listen to the comments from the customers and respond to any concerns or questions that are asked from either you or the customers. Thank you.

COMMISSIONER CARTER: Thank you so kindly.

MS. MASTERTON: If you'd like, I can introduce the other Embarq staff people who are here.

COMMISSIONER CARTER: Go ahead. Put it on the record.

MS. MASTERTON: Okay. We have Charles Rehwinkel, who's our Florida vice president; Joyce Sanders, who's our local public affairs manager; and Sandy Khazraee, who's our regulatory affairs manager. And among all of us I think we'll be able to answer any questions that come up. Thank you.

COMMISSIONER CARTER: Thank you so kindly.

MR. McLEAN: Commissioner Carter, if I might. I just want to say --

COMMISSIONER CARTER: Yes, sir.

MR. McLEAN: -- I am the Public Counsel from the State of Florida. I represent the citizens in actions like this. We generally oppose these kind of increases. We'll be giving this one very close scrutiny to ensure that it complies with state statutes recently enacted by the Legislature.

Thank you, Mr. Chairman. 1 2 COMMISSIONER CARTER: Thank you, Counselor. I notice we have one person here that wants to speak; 3 right? 4 MR. McLEAN: Yes. Ms. Betty Kenyon signed up. 5 Ma'am, if you'd come forward to the microphone and 6 7 tell the Commission your concerns. COMMISSIONER CARTER: Ma'am, because this is a --8 step up to the microphone. Because this is a public hearing 9 and we're going to put everything on the record, I'm going to 10 ask you to raise your right hand and take an oath, please. 11 BETTY KENYON 12 was called as a witness on behalf of the Citizens of the State 13 of Florida and, having been duly sworn, testified as follows: 14 15 Thank you. MS. KENYON: COMMISSIONER CARTER: You are recognized. 16 17 DIRECT STATEMENT MS. KENYON: I want to say I just saw the notice of 18 this hearing in the yesterday Daily News, and I said, "Can I 19 fit it into my schedule?" Because I testified when the PSC was 20 here in April of 2004 about the phone rate increases for 21 22 Verizon, BellSouth and Sprint. Of course, many of us testified against any increases, and we have no competition whatsoever in 23 the county. And so, of course, the increase was put on hold 24 25 for a while after the PSC approved it in December of 2004 and

so on and so on.

But anyhow, we're getting nickeled and dimed to death. I saw the newspaper said it was a 50 cent a month increase. And we as homeowners have had to put up with hurricanes, tropical storms, you name it. And so I just am very puzzled about why this is required at this time.

Now an interesting note is that about, oh, two and a half weeks ago I had occasion to call Embarq because we had no phone service in my neighborhood in Destin -- and talking to people in Oregon and someplace else and on -- oh, we'll get back to you. Well, of course, with my network of neighbors and what have you, I found out that in the City of Destin a contractor had cut the phone line, so our phone service for our entire north end near Indian Trail and Indigo Circle was cut off. Embarq did give us a credit. When I got my phone bill, I saw I had a credit there.

But once again -- I didn't have an opportunity to make a copy when I testified almost three years ago. I gave you a list of all these little nitpicking fees we have to pay. And at the time all these little extra taxes, surcharges, you name it, were more than my basic telephone service. And I don't have all the bells and whistles because I don't want all the bells and whistles. And so now the phone service has increased slightly. My basic phone service is \$12.45. My taxes and fees and so on and surcharges are \$11.76. You say,

well, that's not very much money. But the thing is many of us 1 2 are retired senior citizens on a fixed income. And I'm sure you've heard that before. But the point is when does this 3 stop? You know, I keep -- you know, we have an insurance 4 5 problem, a huge increase in homeowner's insurance, taxes and so on. We individuals, we have to look closely at where our money 6 is going. And everybody is going to say, oh, well, 50 cents a 7 8 month isn't very much. But, yes, it is. Fifty cents can start 9 anybody's little savings account, some little kid's account, 10 this what have you. And I won't belabor that point.

But as I say, I just feel unless Embarq improves their customer service, because I was very turned off by their replies whenever I had the service calls, why give them an increase? Any questions?

COMMISSIONER CARTER: Yes, ma'am.

MS. KENYON: Yes.

commissioner carter: Just for the record, I was excited, I was so excited to see you here today that I forgot to ask you when you stepped up to the microphone, for the record because we have a court reporter, please state your name and address, and what's the name of your carrier, your phone carrier?

MS. KENYON: The last item, what was that?

COMMISSIONER CARTER: The name of your phone carrier.

I think it's Embarg.

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MS. KENYON: Oh, Embarg. Right. 1 COMMISSIONER CARTER: Yes, ma'am. 2 MS. KENYON: My name is Betty J. Kenyon. I live at 3 3805 Indigo Circle in the beautiful City of Destin, Florida. 4 5 Do you need my phone number? Okay. COMMISSIONER CARTER: It's up to you. 6 7 MS. KENYON: Well, it's on the form. COMMISSIONER CARTER: Yes, ma'am. 8 MS. KENYON: But anyhow, as I say, I'm active in 9 10 politics and in the activities in my City of Destin and in the 11 community. 12 COMMISSIONER CARTER: We thank you for coming this 13 morning. 14 And first let me -- Commissioner Tew, do you have any questions? 15 COMMISSIONER TEW: I don't think so. 16 COMMISSIONER CARTER: But we do want to thank you for 17 It's a significant opportunity for us to come out and 18 go around to the different communities that are impacted and 19 find out exactly what the citizens have to say. 20 MS. KENYON: Okay. And I just want to mention I had 21 22 hoped that I would be able to contact some of the people that I know were involved in the issue almost three years ago, but 23 I've had some medical problems and I didn't get a chance to 24 call anyone late yesterday. Because, as I say, I just saw this 25

in the newspaper in the morning. Okay. Thank you. 1 MR. McLEAN: I have a very brief observation for you, 2 if anything else. You mentioned, "When is the end to these 3 And I can't answer for that mass of things that we 4 5 all are exposed to, but I can answer for this one. The Legislature, in its infinite wisdom, decided that 6 this phone company could only collect this charge for one year. 7 8 So it's 50 cents per access line for one year. MS. KENYON: One year? 9 MR. McLEAN: So the Legislature could -- it's good 10 11 that the Legislature limited them to that degree is my 12 suggestion. 13 MS. KENYON: Thank you. As I say, I'm not too 14 impressed with our state Legislature, because I follow some issues closely. 15 MR. McLEAN: Well, I didn't want to whack the 16 hornet's nest, but. 17 18 MS. KENYON: Okay. Thank you very much. COMMISSIONER CARTER: Yes, ma'am. One second. 19 anyone have any questions? Thank you so kindly for coming to 20 21 be with us this morning. We sincerely appreciate, you know, you taking out time from your very busy day to do that. 22 23 MR. McLEAN: Mr. Chairman, I have no further sign ups 24 at the moment. 25 COMMISSIONER CARTER: Okay. We are again in recess.

(Recess taken.) COMMISSIONER CARTER: Go back on the record. now approximately 12:32 Central Standard Time. And, Mr. McLean, do you have any other --MR. McLEAN: I do not, sir. COMMISSIONER CARTER: Well, Commissioner Tew, do you have any comments? No, sir. COMMISSIONER TEW: Anyone in the audience have any COMMISSIONER CARTER: comments that you'd like to make here at this point in time? Seeing none and hearing none, we'll just declare this hearing over. We're adjourned. (Service Hearing adjourned at 12:33 p.m.)
