## ORDER AUTHORIZING APPEARANCE AS QUALIFIED REPRESENTATIVE

In this order we grant two requests made under Rule 28-106.106, Florida Administrative Code, that certain persons be designated as qualified representatives authorized to represent before this Commission the interests of their respective clients, even though they are not admitted to practice law in Florida. As explained in Order No. PSC-07-0008-PCO-OT, issued January 2, 2007, in designating someone as a qualified representatives we authorized that person to appear before the Florida Public Service Commission in any matter during the calendar year.

In designating these persons as qualified representatives, we have confirmed that each application conforms to the requirements of the rule and that, based on the information contained in their respective applications, each person has the necessary qualifications to represent the interests of their respective clients as contemplated under the rule. For example, each of the applicants is admitted to practice law in states other than Florida.

The qualified representative designations are reflected in the Appendix which is incorporated as part of the body this order.

Accordingly, it is

ORDERED by Chairman Lisa Polak Edgar, as Presiding Officer, that the persons identified in the Appendix to this order are authorized to appear as a Qualified Representative for their respective companies in any matter before the Florida Public Service Commission during the calendar year 2007.

## NOTICE OF FURTHER PROCEEDINGS OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

The Florida Public Service Commission is required by Section 120.569(1), Florida Statutes, to notify parties of any administrative hearing or judicial review of Commission orders that is available under Sections 120.57 or 120.68, Florida Statutes, as well as the procedures and time limits that apply. This notice should not be construed to mean all requests for an administrative hearing or judicial review will be granted or result in the relief sought.

Any party adversely affected by the Commission's final action in this matter may request: 1) reconsideration of the decision by filing a motion for reconsideration with the Director, Division of the Commission Clerk and Administrative Services, 2540 Shumard Oak Boulevard, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-0850, within fifteen (15) days of the issuance of this order in the form prescribed by Rule 25-22.060, Florida Administrative Code; or 2) judicial review by the Florida Supreme Court in the case of an electric, gas or telephone utility or the First District Court of Appeal in the case of a water and/or wastewater utility by filing a notice of appeal with the Director, Division of the Commission Clerk and Administrative Services and filing a copy of the notice of appeal and the filing fee with the appropriate court. This filing must be completed within thirty (30) days after the issuance of this order, pursuant to Rule 9.110, Florida Rules of Appellate Procedure. The notice of appeal must be in the form specified in Rule 9.900(a), Florida Rules of Appellate Procedure.
