Sections 366.093(3) Florida Statutes, states: Proprietary confidential business information means information, regardless of form or characteristics, which is owned or controlled by the person or company, is intended to be and is treated by the person or company as private in that the disclosure of the information would cause harm to the ratepayers or the person's or company's business operations, and has not been disclosed unless disclosed pursuant to a statutory provision, an order of a court or administrative body, or private agreement that provides


Disclosure of this information also would substantially impair FPL's prospective ability to solicit bids, to the detriment of FPL and its customers. Therefore, this information is confidential pursuant to section 366.093 (3)(d) and (e), Florida Statutes. In accord with Section 366.093 (4), Florida Statutes, staff recommends that the document remains confidential for a period of eighteen months from the date of the request. Prior to the end of the eighteen month time period, it is anticipated that either FPL can renew its request for confidential status or the affected documents can be returned.
