By this letter, Commission staff requests responses to the following data requests:

- 1. On page 3 of the petition Indiantown states that "there are smaller scale residential projects on the drawing board that could be served directly by Indiantown." What are the proposed residences and how many potential homes would this include?
- 2. Please provide a comparison of a typical Indiantown Gas Company residential customer's bill before and after the proposed TS-1 conservation rate.
- 3. Please provide RIM and Participation Test results of each proposed program without including the proposed \$0.1430 per therm Energy Conservation Cost Recovery factor and the additional \$2.03 charge to Indiantown's Transitional Transportation Service Pool Manager.
- 4. Please provide the 2006 fuel billing from Infinite Energy for Indiantown's Transitional Transportation Service (TTS) Program, which was used in calculating the cost of gas used in the RIM and Participants Tests.
- 5. On page 22 of the petition Indiantown states that it would like to adjust its Transportation Charge for each currently approved tariff rate schedule to include the proposed ECCR rates. What is the basis of such proposal since ECCR rates do not appear as a separate line item on a customer's bill.
