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



Dear Chairman Edgar:

Having reviewed your Staff's recommendation and rule proposal in the subject Docket relating to contracts for renewable energy facilities, I am concerned with the direction in which the Commission may be heading. As the bill's sponsor, I can say that Section 366.91, F.S. is intended to immediately diversify Florida's fuel mix and reduce reliance on natural gas for electricity production by bold actions designed to encourage renewable energy facilities – both existing and new. Unfortunately, as I understand it, your staff is proposing rules that differ very little, if at all, from existing "QF" rules rules that arose out of proceedings before the Commission in 1982, nearly a quarter century ago by a completely different group of Commissioners and for a very different purpose. It was precisely because the Legislature was not satisfied with the status quo that Section 366.91, F.S. was enacted to clearly express to the Commission its intent that major changes be made to your avoided cost policies regarding renewable energy. Simply put, Florida must substantially increase its use of renewable energy.

As Chair of the Joint Administrative Procedures Committee, the proposed rule does not appear to be consistent with expressed legislative intent of Section 366.91, F.S. For example, we are concerned that the proposed rule would continue to use an "old" method for determining avoided capacity payments based on the next utility generating plant and, that the formula will only yield "back loaded" payments which can make project financing difficult or impossible. I am advised that the formula, contained in both the existing and proposed rules, was developed by an electric utility for a different purpose and at a very different time - over 25 years ago. It critical that the Commission develop its own new avoided cost formula reflecting the realities of today and robustly advancing the Legislature's express desire to immediately diversify fuel mix and reduce reliance natural gas for electricity production – including the recognition that capacity from renewable energy producers is deemed "needed" for capacity payment purposes on the date the renewable energy facility elects to begin to sell electricity, as opposed to the date of the next planned utility unit as contained in both the existing and proposed rules. Moreover, the rules must assure that standard contract terms and conditions are conducive to the encouragement of renewable energy resources and are reflective of the concerns and needs of the renewable energy industry. (Although a substantial number of comments have been submitted by renewable energy advocates, they were by and large summarily rejected by your Staff.) Furthermore, contracts for renewable energy producers must be available

immediately and continuously, and capacity and energy payments under those contracts must also be available immediately – something that is lacking in the rule proposal.

The Commission is right to be concerned over the impact of its actions on the cost of electricity to the State's electric consumers. However, the high cost of not encouraging renewable energy is already being borne by the ratepayers through several extraordinarily large increases in electric rates resulting from increases in the price of natural gas and lack of fuel diversity. It is not acceptable to ignore the clear intent of Section 366.91, F.S. on the basis that it "might" increase costs. To the contrary, the encouragement of renewable energy will protect Florida consumer from future uncontrollable increases in electric rates due to natural gas price volatility and lack of diversity in our generating fuel mix.

I trust you will take these comment into account when consider this matter at your agenda conference next week. In the meantime, if you have any questions or would like to discuss my concerns, please feel free to contact me or Cheryl Ennis of my staff.

The Florida PSC and FPL could do much more to provide incentives for renewable energy to help relieve our dependence on foreign oil and energy sources that produce hazardous The PSC should help to generate a state-wide market in trading renewable energy waste. credits. The new Florida solar energy incentive program provides rebates and allows homeowners who invest in Solar energy generating systems (grid-connected photovoltaic systems) to own the renewable energy credits (RECs) associated with their system. The PSC should require FPL to produce an increasing percentage of its power from renewable and non-nuclear energy sources over a multi-year period, thereby creating a market for RECs. The market in other states offer \$.10 or more per KWH so a homeowner with a 5 kw system producing 20 kwh per day could earn \$730 per year to help offset their big investment in solar energy. This additional benefit, in addition to existing and updated federal tax credits, would provide a better investment climate and much better incentive for homeowners to make the big up-front investment for solar PV. FPS's Sunshine energy Program provides no incentive for homeowners. Rather than FPL investing in renewable energy itself, it is using customers voluntary contributions to build renewable energy sources. A performance-based requirement for renewable energy generation would create a Florida REC market and urge FPL to really invest in renewable energy.

Florida Public Service Commission Adopts Rules to Promote Renewable Energy Generation

TALLAHASSEE — The Florida Public Service Commission (PSC) today adopted new rules designed to promote the development of renewable energy resources in the state. The rules provide developers of renewable energy a greater variety of pricing options when entering agreements to sell energy to Florida's five investor owned utilities (IOU). The greater flexibility will help existing and potential renewable energy providers finance new projects and strengthen the position of established facilities.

"Encouraging the growth of Florida's renewable energy market will help the state reduce its growing dependency on natural gas for electric production and provide consumers with a diverse fuel mix less subject to volatile price fluctuations," said PSC Chairman Lisa Polak Edgar. "The innovative rules adopted today represent a balance between the interests of developers of renewable energy generation, Florida's investor-owned utilities and the state's consumers."

The PSC also directed the IOUs, municipal electric utilities and rural electric cooperatives to report annually on the level of renewable generation in their service areas. As directed by the Florida Legislature, the Commission will continue to encourage the growth of renewable generation and development of viable energy sources, ensuring greater energy and economic security for Florida.

The PSC is committed to making sure Florida's consumers receive essential electric, natural gas, telephone, water, and wastewater services in a safe, affordable, and reliable manner. The PSC exercises regulatory authority over utilities in the areas of rate base/economic regulation, competitive market oversight, and monitoring of safety, reliability, and service.

PROPOSED RULE LANGUAGE CHANGES

1/09/07 Agender Item 3

Rule 25-17.210

The following changes and additions should be made to the proposed Rule 25-17.210:

(1) "Renewable Generating Facility" means an electrical generating unit or group of units at a single site, interconnected for synchronous operation and delivery of electricity to an electric utility, where 75 percent, at a minimum, of the pPrimary eEnergy Source in British Thermal Units (BTUs) used for the production of electricity is from one or more of the following sources: hydrogen produced from sources other than fossil fuels, biomass, solar energy, geothermal, energy, wind energy, ocean energy, hydroelectric power, or waste heat from a commercial or industrial manufacturing process.

- "Primary Energy Source" means the fuel or fuels used for the generation of electric energy, except that such term does not include:
 - the minimum amounts of fuel required for ignition, startup, testing, flame stabilization, and control uses, and
 - the minimum amounts of fuel required to alleviate or prevent emergencies, directly affecting the public health, safety, or welfare, which would result from electric power outages.

The following changes should be made to the proposed Rule 25-17.250(1):

(1) Standard Offer Contract. In addition to the requirements contained in Rules 25-17.082 through 25-17.091, F.A.C., each investor owed utility shall, by April 1 of each year, file with the Commission a standard offer contract or contracts for the purchase of firm capacity and energy from renewable generating facilities—and small qualifying facilities with a design capacity of 100 kW or less. A separate standard offer contract shall be based on the next avoidable fossil fueled generating unit of each technology type identified in the utility's Ten-Year Site Plan filed pursuant to Rule 25-22.071, F.A.C. Each standard offer contract based on each of the utility's avoidable units shall be consistent with the requirements of Rule 25-17.0832(4), (5), and (6), F.A.C., except as modified by this rule. Each investor-owned utility with no planned generating unit identified in its Ten-Year Site Plan shall submit a standard offer based on avoiding or deferring a planned purchase.

The following subsection should be added to the proposed Rule 25-17.250(2)(a):

3. The generating unit upon which the standard offer contract was based is no longer part of the utility's generation plan, as evidenced by a petition to that effect filed with the Commission or by the utility's most recent Ten Year Site Plan.

The following additions should be made to the proposed Rule 25-17.250(6)(b):

(b) Firm energy payments. Subsequent to the determination of full avoided cost and subject to the provisions of Rule 25-17.0832(3)(a) through (d), F.A.C., a portion of the base energy costs associated with the avoided unit, mutually agreed upon by the utility and renewable energy generator, shall be fixed and amortized on a present value basis over the term of the contract starting, at the election of the renewable generating facility, as early as the in-service date of the renewable generating facility. "Base energy costs associated with the avoided unit" means the energy costs of the avoided unit to the extent the unit would have been operated.

The following additions should be made to the proposed Rule 25-17.270:

All contracts for the purchase of capacity and energy from a renewable generating facility shall include a provision to reopen the contract, at the election of either party, limited to changes affecting the utility's full avoided costs of the unit on which the contract is based as a result of new environmental and other regulatory requirements enacted during the term of the contract.

The following change should be added to the proposed Rule 25-17.290:

An investor-owned utility shall not impose any imputed debt equivalent adjustments (equity adjustments) to reduce the avoided costs paid to a renewable generating facility without the approval of the Commission—as a result of an evidentiary hearing pursuant to Chapter 120, Florida Statutes.
