MS. MILLER: Okay. Pursuant to notice issued in the October 23 Florida Administrative Weekly, this is a Rule Development Workshop regarding revisions to Rule 25-22.107 and 25-22.1035, and let me make sure we've got them all covered here, repeal of Rule 25-22.107, and I believe that does it. Oh, and 25-22.105 for a revision.

I'm Cindy Miller, a Senior Attorney with the GCL office. With me are Ann Cole, the Clerk of the Commission, Lee Kissell the head of the Office of Information Technology, and his staff, Benjamin Legaspi. We have put materials on the cart by the door. Also we have a sign-in sheet.

The materials that we've laid out, we've put the rule revisions, we've put the letter from Department of State that's dated October 6th, 2009, saying that we have approval to go with this process. We have placed Section 120.53, which is the statute on maintenance of orders and gives us our authority to go with an electronic database. And we've also placed on the cart a list that Department of State provided us of which agencies are doing their own orders, publishing or using their own website for an official reporter.

The way we will proceed is to give some brief discussion on the rules, and then have a PowerPoint on

the process to be used for obtaining the orders, and receive your comments and discuss next steps.

I'm going to start with Ann Cole giving us a discussion on the Clerk's Office role and perspective.

website as far as the Clerk's Office is concerned is that the orders are given to the Clerk's Office for issuance or for signature, and then they're scanned, and they are in most cases electronically sent to the parties of record via e-mail addresses. If there's no e-mail, then they're faxed to the parties. And then if there's no fax, then they are sent U.S. mail by envelopes.

In order to electronically serve the orders on the parties of record, they have to be scanned first. And so the parties receive the format of the order that has the document number stamp, and once they're served, then they're placed on the website -- I wouldn't say immediately but close to immediately. So the feeling in the Clerk's Office is that we're already providing an electronic database on the website without the delay caused by a publication. So I'm available to answer questions at whatever point that will open it up for that kind of discussion.

MS. MILLER: Ann, also you mentioned that if

the Commission votes to proceed this way, that we will 1 2 still be retaining the books published by FALR. 3 MS. COLE: Right. We do keep the books in the 4 Clerk's Office for the public to use as research tools, 5 and they will remain in the Clerk's Office even when, when, if we go forward with this process. 6 7 MS. MILLER: Thank you. Okay. I was just going to briefly go through the rules themselves and 8 kind of explain what we're doing with them. I should 9 mention that Craig Hewitt is here also, and he's doing 10 the statement of estimated regulatory costs. 11 The first rule is 25-22.103 called Orders 12 13 That would be repealed. And the reason is Indexed. that with an electronic database you don't have the same 14 requirement for indexing that you have with a 15 16 publication. We will still have the regular system that 17 you're used to seeing. There will be no change to that. 18 MS. COLE: No change except possibly 19 enhancements depending on feedback from the public. 20 MS. MILLER: So the numbering and the orders 21 and all that will be the same. 22 MS. COLE: Right. That will continue. 23 MS. MILLER: Okay. The next rule is 24 25-22.105, Electronic Database of Orders and Other 25 Records. This is to place it at our website and this

would be the big change, and it tells you a little bit

about the search capability. And Benji will be

discussing that as well.

And it notes on here that information will be added to the Commission's website within 24 hours of the issuance of the document by the Office of the Commission Clerk. And this emphasizes that this is to be a very timely process.

Rule 25-22.107, Plan for Making Orders

Available to the Public, this also gives a contact name and even that questions may be faxed when there's difficulty in obtaining the orders. And I know you'll see when Benji does his presentation that also we'll be asking on the website for any suggestions or concerns.

And the last rule is the rule on the official reporter, 25-22.1035, and this one is to designate the website to be the published, publication of our orders.

So those are the actual rules. And if we don't have any questions on those, I'm going to go next for our presentation to Benjamin Legaspi.

MR. LEGASPI: All right. I'm going to describe the process by which we maintain the order information, collect and maintain the order information on our website.

PSC orders, I, I define these -- when you're

searching for information on PSC orders, I define two types of ways that we give this information. The first is what I call existing information. So these are preformatted reports that we publish weekly or recent order details. So this is the last 100 orders issued by the Commission in reverse chronological order.

The second type of way you can get information on orders is through an information search. So here you're not relying on preformatted reports. You are actually searching actively for orders based on certain selection criteria.

And the way we do that is through search for order data using our Case Management system, or you can search for content of the orders using our Thunderstone Search Appliance, and I'm going to elaborate on those two in a bit.

This is the page that we have, are proposing for our order search. A lot of the functionality is already present in our website in various other pages, but I've selected certain functionalities and incorporated them into this single page for convenience. So this page is grouped in five main sections.

The first are the complete pages. These are the full versions of the web pages that are found on different, different areas of our website. There's a

link, as Cindy mentioned, for submitting comments, suggestions, questions, whatever, about this page or really any other page on our website. And lastly there's a link for, for help, help related to this, to this web page.

The existing orders, the existing order information is in, I mentioned in two parts, the weekly summary of orders and the recent order details. So the weekly summary of orders, these are PDFs consisting of, that contain information about the orders that were submitted in the last week.

Weekly summary of orders -- recent order details is in a panel there. That's one of the latest 100 orders in reverse chronological order. I don't know if you can see, but it is actually a scrollable panel so that if you don't find the order that you're looking for at the top, you can scroll downwards.

So these two panels at the top may give you the order information that you want without you having to look for it. So, you know, if you're lucky, it's a recent order, you may find what you're looking for just, just using the existing information.

If you don't and you actively have to search for your orders, then you can search for your order data or content. The left panel is the search for data and

the right is for when you're searching for content of the, of the order itself.

So I'm going to go into each of these in a little more detail. The useful links, this is what it looks like. If you click on the advanced search, it brings you to our full search on the website, our full advanced search on the website. It differs from the functionality on the orders search page in that you can search for documents that are not orders, you can search for documents on the website itself, website content itself, you can search for filings, other information not necessarily limited to orders.

The order data search page looks like this here. Its functionality focuses mostly on searching for orders based on a date range or industry, and/or industry. And historically that has been the search criteria that most client, clients want of this website. If that functionality is different now or if you want some more criteria, then, you know, you just have to, to let me know.

Docket searches related, this is searching for information related to dockets. And as you can see, there are links to orders, search for orders and tariffs also on the, on the lower left.

Weekly summary of dockets, new orders, the

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summary of orders is at the bottom. We also issue weekly reports based on the latest dockets that have been issued.

Here is where you submit feedback. Again, on any page that's on our website or if you have problems, questions, complaints, suggestions, anything related to this new proposed order search page, this is where you could, you would submit that and I get the, the feedback from it.

And lastly there's a help link at the bottom, how to use this page. It has a description of each of the panels there on the left and a screen shot on the right so that there's no confusion as to what, what we're talking about.

Weekly summary of orders looks like this.

These are PDF links. You click on one of them and you bring up a PDF and the information you're looking for might be here. So it is pretty much a static page. You can print it out, read it, but there's -- store it maybe, but there's really not much more that, that you can do with that.

Recent order details, again this is the panel which shows orders issued in reverse chronological order. The links here are active. So if you click on one link, then you go to the orders details page which

gives you information about the order issued, and here are the documents themselves. So you can click on the word or the PDF files associated with the order in order to access the information directly.

Now if you find you can't, you can't find the information you're looking for there, then you have to search either the data or the content, and this is how the order data is maintained at the PSC. Information related to dockets and orders are kept in our Case Management System. So the Clerk's Office enters that information. It is stored in our FoxPro databases on our internal servers. The website can't use FoxPro directly, so these databases are converted into a format called SQL, standard query language.

The information is updated roughly 15-minute intervals so that if there is a change made in the Case Management System FoxPro version, then we update the SQL version roughly within 15 minutes. So when you are asking for order information or order data, what you are actually doing is you are querying the SQL databases, and we do this through the website.

So what happens here is if you are here in the public, you're asking for, for information, your, your request for information goes to our website. It is reformatted, it is packaged into a query where it's sent

to the SQL databases, and the information is returned to the web server, it is reformatted into HTML, sent down to your web browser. So that's how you get the information that you're looking for. So the, the information loop happens here: Public, website, databases and back again. So as long as the search you're looking for is based on fields or information that is stored in our data tables, it's going to be very accurate.

Here's what the search panel for order data looks like again. If you know the number of the order, for example, and, I don't know, for some reason you can't find it and you want to see maybe it's been issued or not, you click, you enter your order number there, click on the order number button, and right below it you get a panel that shows the results. So the links again here are active. They point to the order itself. At the bottom there's what I call the related documents list. These are any files that the Clerk's Office has placed in the same folder as the order itself.

You can search for a key word in the order title, just one key word. So you enter the key word there in that box, click on the order title button, and it will give you the results again in a panel just below it. So here I'm looking for information related to

Supra. I hit the order title box and you can see the information is displayed below it. I've expanded the panel here to show you that it is again a scrollable box. So if you don't see what you find immediately, you can go down again, reverse chronological order, and see if the information you're looking for is, is somewhere further down.

MS. VANDIVER: May I ask a quick question?

MR. LEGASPI: Sure.

MS. VANDIVER: Where you have the "Order Title (keyword)," are you searching words just in the order title?

MR. LEGASPI: Yes.

MS. VANDIVER: And then the other one is in the order itself?

MR. LEGASPI: Yes. So that's kind of the point I wanted to make, that as long as you're searching for data in the fields that we maintain, it will be very accurate. But if it's not information that we maintain, you know, if it's somewhere else, if it's not a field like filing date or title or something like that, then this data search is not going to help you. That's when you might have to turn to the text content search itself.

MS. VANDIVER: Okay. Is that what's in the

right box or --

2 MR. LEGASPI: Yes.

THE COURT REPORTER: Can y'all speak up or come closer?

MS. VANDIVER: I'm sorry.

MR. HEWITT: I had a question. Are the docket numbers associated inside the orders? In other words, you can get the docket number in an order, but can you get an order in a docket number -- or how does -- does it go both ways?

MR. LEGASPI: You can. I haven't, I haven't built that into this, but you can. In other places on the website I have done it, but that's certainly something I can, I can look into adding into this page.

Okay. So we go into order content here.

You're looking for, you're looking for a phrase or a word, a key word in the content of the order itself. To do this, again we, we use our SQL Case Management System databases, and through daily updates we keep the orders on the website. So every day I have a program that checks for recently issued orders. And the purpose here is that the filing, the website here, the end result is that the website maintains a folder called orders, and it has to have every, every order that we have in digital format. So every day it checks do I have every

single order issued, whether it's a recent one or whether it's one that through our archive process we just now have in digital format. If it doesn't have it, then it's copied over to the, to the website.

MS. MILLER: Let me, let me interrupt just to say that if you have questions, we welcome you at the table. There's plenty of room, and it will help with the microphones.

MR. LEGASPI: Nobody is taking you up on that offer.

So right now there are close to 46,000 documents on our web server all related to orders that have been issued now or in the past going back to about 1987.

To search these we use our Thunderstone Search Appliance. Now what the Thunderstone appliance does is it maintains an index. The index you can think of as a list of key words, and for each key word it contains a list of documents that have that key word. That's a pretty rough way to look at it.

So if you were looking for order content, what you are doing is you're actually querying the Thunderstone Search Appliance. The way we do that here is again through our web, our web server. So here you're sitting at your client terminal here, you send a

request for information to our web server. The Web server reformats that into a query that Thunderstone can interpret. The result called a data set is sent back to the web server. The web server reformats that into HTML that goes to your web, to your client PC, and you see the results hopefully on your, on your PC. So here the information loop is this way: From here, web server, Thunderstone results back that way, instead of going to our SQL databases as when you're searching for order data.

So it looks like this. This is the search order content. It's on the right panel, lower right panel. And here I've -- you can ignore the yellow box. It's there only because I want to show that you can also search by category. Categories here is the year that the order was issued. So you can search on a search term, a key word or phrase and optionally select a year the order was issued.

So I'm going to go through a few examples of queries. For example, you're searching for acquisition adjustment in orders issued in 2009. That's what it looks like. You've entered the words acquisition and adjustment here. You've changed the drop down to show only 2009 orders, clicked search, and here are the results. The links here are active that point to the

document itself, and here is the link -- in green is the link to the URL that you are accessing directly. As you can see -- I don't know if you can see it here, but it is in a folder called Orders/09 folder, the document, the file name and other information, filing date, et

cetera.

The way I've done it here is I've entered the two words acquisition and adjustment separately. So what the search here does is it looks for those two words in the index and it gives highest priority to documents where the two words are closer together. If I wanted to search just for the phrase acquisition adjustment, I could put the two words in quotation marks so that was just the phrase or I can hyphenate it. I can search for acquisition-adjustment so it's searching for the phrase acquisition adjustment.

You have to be a little careful though if you're doing it that way because you might type in this instead. The search here is now for acquisition minus adjustment. So the space there means you're searching for the word acquisition but you don't want adjustment to show up in your results. Again, this is for 2009 orders. So you would do this if you are searching for the word acquisition but you don't want the phrase acquisition adjustment. Here's the results of that.

And as you can see in bold, the hits are for orders 1 issued in 2009 just for the words acquisition and 2 acquisition adjustment is not showing. MS. MILLER: So you're saying that it 4 automatically makes that a minus when you put a space. 5 MR. LEGASPI: Yes. 6 MS. MILLER: And if you don't want these 7 minus, you would do what? 8 MR. LEGASPI: You would not, not put, not type 9 10 it in. I mean you would not type in the minus sign. MS. MILLER: Oh. I thought you were saying if 11 12 you just put a space. No, you're not saying that. 13 MR. LEGASPI: If you, if you just put a space, 14 say acquisition, space, adjustment, then you're 15 searching for those two words. 16 MS. MILLER: Oh, okay. 17 MR. LEGASPI: The hyphenation then is just 18 that you want the two words together as a phrase. It 19 gets a little confusing. That's why I've got the help, 20 the search, the link for comments or questions. 21 The last example and actually the last slide 22 is the use of wild cards. So here I'm searching for any 23 word that begins with T-E-L-E. The star means it's a 24 wild card. Any characters after that is, is, is fair 25 game. So this is what happens when I do that. Here

1	I've relaxed the search for year just to show you a
2	variety of results. And as you can see, it is hitting
3	on the words telecommunications, telephone and telecom.
4	So I'm going to end by saying that if there
5	are any comments, questions, complaints, suggestions,
6	then go to the, that link for contact with the website
7	team, and I guarantee you I will give you an answer.
8	MS. VANDIVER: Can I bring up a couple? I'll
9	come up here.
10	MS. MILLER: Please, Denise.
11	MS. VANDIVER: You kept saying key words.
12	MR. LEGASPI: Yes.
13	MS. VANDIVER: Are those predefined by you or
14	they can be any words we come up with?
15	MR. LEGASPI: No. They can be any words that
16	you come up with.
17	MS. VANDIVER: Okay.
18	MR. LEGASPI: The way what I mean by key
19	word is just one word.
20	MS. VANDIVER: Okay.
21	MR. LEGASPI: See, I wanted to emphasize that
22	you're searching for one word.
23	MS. VANDIVER: Okay.
24	MR. LEGASPI: It can be any, any word.
25	MS. VANDIVER: I just wanted to make sure you

didn't have a list. 1 MR. LEGASPI: As long as it's in the title. 2 No. There's no predetermined list that you 3 No. No. can only search for these key, these words. 4 5 MS. VANDIVER: Okav. MR. LEGASPI: I don't know if key word is the 6 7 best word to use. MS, VANDIVER: No. That's fine. I just 8 9 wanted to make sure I wasn't reading something into it. 10 MR. LEGASPI: No. MS. VANDIVER: The other question I had is I 11 12 like the idea of searching for orders by year. Would it 13 be possible to add a feature where you could define the 14 time period? Say, you know, like when you go on 15 Travelocity and you put your dates in or something, if 16 you wanted to put in January 1 of '85 to January 1 of 17 '90 or something, instead of making five different 18 searches? 19 MR. LEGASPI: It's a little, it's a little 20 trickier to do it that way. 21 MS. VANDIVER: Okay. 22 MR. LEGASPI: Because, you see, the problem is 23 that it's not a, it's not a data search. 24 MS. VANDIVER: Oh. 25 MR. LEGASPI: Okay? So in the, in the -- if

you're searching on the data tables, then it's very 1 2 easy. MS. VANDIVER: Okay. You're doing it -- okay. 3 MR. LEGASPI: Right. 4 MS. VANDIVER: Okay. 5 MR. LEGASPI: So to do what you're saying, if 6 I wanted -- if you wanted to be able to search for, say, 7 a five-year period, say you wanted to search for orders 8 only in 2000 to 2004, for example, then I would have to 9 redo, reconfigure the folder structure so that I have a 10 folder there that says 2000 to 2004, and then put all 11 12 those documents in there. 13 MS. VANDIVER: Right. Okay. MR. LEGASPI: Because the Thunderstone search 14 15 is based on a folder's structure. So that's why it's --16 when we were coming up with this, we had to decide, you 17 know, do we give the finest resolution or do we give it 18 in blocks of years? So we did, we did it in finest 19 resolution. 20 MS. VANDIVER: Oh, that's fine. I just wanted 21 to make sure. Okay. 22 MR. KISSELL: And you searched the category everything but put the dates in your search criteria? 23 24 MR. LEGASPI: You can try to do that. 25 problem though, the problem with searching for

everything though is that the results of Thunderstone, 1 you can't tell what sequence those results are going to 2 be in. See, I have no control over that. I just give 3 them, Thunderstone the query, and then it gives me back the results. Unlike the data, you see, unlike the data 5 that I see the data, I can manipulate the data, at every 6 7 step of the process I can, I can interfere, I can do 8 something with it. With the Thunderstone box, you know, when it 9 10 comes back, I have no control over, over the, the order 11 of items it returns. 12 MS. VANDIVER: Uh-huh. 13 MR. LEGASPI: So it's hard. 14 MS. VANDIVER: Are some of these features on 15 the website now, searching for key words and things like 16 that? 17 MR. LEGASPI: Yes. Yes. 18 MS. VANDIVER: Okay. 19 MS. MILLER: Going back to your statement you 20 made on key words, did you say that you can only use one 21 word as a key word? 22 MR. LEGASPI: Yeah. 23 MR. KISSELL: That's in the data search, not 24 the content search.

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MS. MILLER: Thank you, Lee. Thank you.

25

MR. KISSELL: Yes. 1 MR. LEGASPI: And it has to be a key word only 2 in the title, you see. 3 MS. MILLER: Okay. So in the content search, which has been my primary interest in this rulemaking, 5 you're fine with it. 6 MR. LEGASPI: Oh, yeah. You can search for as 7 many, as many words as you want. 8 MS. MILLER: Okay. Good. 9 MR. LEGASPI: In fact, there was a question, 10 can you search for two phrases? And actually you can. 11 So I actually added that to the, to the tips. If you 12 want to search for two phrases, this is how you do it. 13 MS. MILLER: Billy Stiles, did you have a 14 question also? 15 MR. STILES: Maybe. First of all, I wanted to 16 say I appreciate your efforts, what you're doing, 17 because just every now and then I'll go on the website 18 to try to search for orders. And so any enhancement 19 that you do to the searchability of that database is 20 going to be very much appreciated by us, and I'm sure 21 22 lots of other people, as Denise is nodding yes. How far back will we be able to search in the 23 content search? How many, how many years back? 24 MS. COLE: We've got some back to 1987 now. 25

MR. STILES: Okay.

MS. COLE: We're working on a project in the Clerk's Office called the Historical Project where we're scanning records in that were never scanned. And those are being verified or checked page by page to make sure that the PDF document is identical to the document that was filed. And included in this process is attachments and exhibits, whatever, whatever the original filed document was no matter how voluminous it is.

MR. STILES: That'll be helpful. I'm sure that's a time-consuming process too, so.

MS. COLE: Right. Well, back to 2007 a page-by-page verification has been done on the PDF documents, and the current documents are verified page by page, so.

MS. MILLER: That's a good question and
something that I wanted to mention.

The way that we're structuring this, we would become the official reporter for January 1, 2010, forward, and the FPSC reporter that FALR does would be still the official reporter for that prior time period.

MR. STILES: Oh.

MS. MILLER: At least that's the way we're starting it. Mr. Konish, who is with the FPSC reporter, has said that he plans to continue to publish the blue

books, and which I know some people like hard copies and 1 they will be very glad to hear that. 2 3 MR. STILES: Right. MS. MILLER: And his will be the official 4 reporter still for the prior years. And it's the prior 5 years that we will still be maintaining in the Clerk's 6 Office, but not then January 2010 forward, if, if all 7 8 this is approved. 9 MR. HEWITT: I had a question about that. Our rule change is going to reduce the demand for 10 the subscriptions for FALR. 11 THE COURT REPORTER: I can't hear you. 12 13 sorry. MR. HEWITT: I'm sorry. Our rule change is 14 15 going to decrease the demand for FALR's subscription 16 service. Is that -- I would take that to be true. Does 17 anybody know the cost of that subscription service? 18 MS. MILLER: I believe the subscription 19 service is 1,900 a year. 20 MR. HEWITT: 1,900 a year. Okay. That's 21 useful. Thank you. 22 MS. MILLER: And many people continue to like 23 hard copy, and it may be that there's a comfort level in 24 having those. It's been an excellent service through 25 the years, and it may be something that many law firms

and companies will continue. We just don't know. 1 Let's see. Are there anymore questions for 2 3 Benji? MR. STILES: Just one, and I wanted to make 4 sure I understood. I think you said that in the content 5 search we would be searching for key words, we're not 6 searching for phrases within the orders, or did I get 7 8 that wrong? 9 MR. LEGASPI: You can search for key words and 10 phrases. 11 MR. STILES: Oh. So if we just happen to 12 remember a string of words in the one order that we're 13 looking for, we could search for that. 14 MR. LEGASPI: Yes. 15 MR. STILES: Okay. 16 MS. MILLER: Okay, Thank you. 17 MR. STILES: That happens once in a while. 18 MS. MILLER: I think we're at the point now 19 for any public comment. 20 Do you see concerns from your offices? 21 that we only have two, two offices present today, but --22 MR. STILES: No. 23 MS. VANDIVER: I don't think so. No. 24 MR. STILES: No. Huh-uh. No. I think we're 25 just looking forward to the enhancements maybe to the

searchability of the orders on your website.

this morning gotten a docket number. It's 090502. We, as we mentioned, we have received Department of State approval for moving forward. So what our plan is is to go next with a recommendation to agenda. And it's our, our goal that we're going to go to the December 1 agenda, and, you know, then we would publish the proposed rules if the Commission votes to proceed. And then parties have, or interested persons have 21 days after that to file comments or a request for hearing.

And we have checked with the Department of
State and also with the Joint Administrative Procedures
Committee about the fact that the actual effective date
of the rule may be a little later than January 1, and we
have been told that that would not be a problem. It
will probably be early February.


Also we have contacted people with the appellate Florida Bar rules and we will need to make a change in those. And they've said that that can be done, it doesn't have to be simultaneously, but will be done in the future. That we will -- if we get approval and everything moves forward, we will also be contacting them on the rule itself. Let's see, that is Rule 9.800, Uniform Citation System, Florida Bar appellate rules.

I think that's all the information that I have 1 today. Ann, do you have any further points that you'd 2 3 like to make? MS. COLE: If you could, since you both are here, if you could get your staff in your office to go 5 ahead and go online and kind of look at it or do some 6 searches and give us comments without, you know, waiting 7 8 two months, that would be great. 9 MS. VANDIVER: Okay. MR. STILES: Is this functionality already 10 11 online now? 12 MR. LEGASPI: Not yet. 13 MS. COLE: Oh. 14 MR. STILES: Okay. 15 MS. COLE: Some of it is though, isn't it? 16 some of it? 17 MR. LEGASPI: Well, the functionality that's 18 online is the separate web pages. In lieu of the requirement for making available for public inspection and copying a hierarchical subject-matter index of its orders, an agency may maintain and make available for public use an electronic database of its orders that allows users to research and retrieve the full texts of agency orders by devising an ad hoc indexing system employing any logical search terms in common usage which are composed by the user and which are contained in the orders of the agency or by descriptive information about the order which may not be specifically contained in the order.
- c. The agency orders that must be indexed, unless excluded under paragraph (c) or paragraph (d), include:
- (I) Each final agency order resulting from a proceeding under s. 120.57 or s. 120.573.
- (II) Each final agency order rendered pursuant to s. 120.57(4) which contains a statement of agency policy that may be the basis of future agency decisions or that may otherwise contain a statement of precedential value.
- (III) Each declaratory statement issued by an agency.
- (IV) Each final order resulting from a proceeding under s. 120.56 or s. 120.574.
- 3. A list of all final orders rendered pursuant to s. 120.57(4) which have been excluded from the indexing requirement of this section, with the approval of the Department of State, because they do not contain statements of agency policy or statements of precedential value. The list must include the name of the parties to the proceeding and the number assigned to the final order.

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### 25-22.105 Electronic Database of Orders and Other Records System for Indexing Orders.

(1) The Commission's electronic database The index shall be available from the Commission's Web site located at www.psc.state.fl.us/dockets/cms. and alphabetically arranged by main subject headings representing major categories of the Commission's regulatory jurisdiction, and taken from the Florida Statutes index, when applicable. The applicable titles of citations of the Florida Statutes construed within the final order may determine the main subject headings and subheadings in the index. The index shall show the main subject headings in all capital letters, flush left on the page, followed by relevant subheadings which shall be initial caps and lower case letters indented. Subheadings and subsubheadings shall reflect increasingly specific areas or subjects addressed in Commission orders and may be taken from the text of the Florida Statutes construed. Subheadings and subsubheadings at equal indentations shall also be alphabetized. The FPSCR citation to orders shall be listed sequentially in an indentation immediately below the applicable sub or subsubheading. Cross references shall be used to direct the user to subject headings which contain the relevant information. The database shall include the ability to electronically search dockets by docket number, docket title, and document number. The ability to search by rRelated key words (specific words, terms, and phrases) and common and colloquial words shall be available from the "advanced search" feature on the main search page of the Commission's Web site at http://www.floridapsc.com/search.
