This letter, pursuant to Rule 25-30.430, Florida Administrative Code, requests approval of a test year for Lake Utility Services, Inc. (the "Company"). The Company intends to submit an application for general rate relief to the Florida Public Service Commission for its water and wastewater systems located in Lake County, Florida. The Company intends to submit the minimum filing requirements ("MFRs") on or before December 31, 2010.

The Company's last rate proceeding and review of rate base was in Docket No. 070693-WS, utilizing a projected test year ending June 30, 2009, which culminated in Order No. PSC-09-0101-PAA-WS, issued February 16, 2009.

The Company requests an historic test year ending June 30, 2010. The requested

The Company currently proposes to make the following pro forma additions:

- 1. Design, permit and construct a water supply well into the Lower Floridan Aquifer as mandated by St. Johns River WMD. There is a need to decrease negative impacts to wetlands and surface water bodies caused by groundwater withdrawal from the Upper Floridan Aquifer using LUSI's existing wells. Scheduled to be on line by 12/31/11. Cost estimate: \$1,000,000
- 2. Execute a feasibility study for the land purchase of a suitable site for the future Northeast WTP. This will identify where another LFA well similar to the one mentioned in Item #1 is constructed to meet additional demand generated from future customer growth and consistent with our master water supply plan. Cost estimate: \$100,000
- 3. Complete the Consumptive Use Permit renewal process currently under way, including a merger of the LUSI North and LUSI South CUPs into one CUP for the combined system. The renewal process was initiated in 2007 and is expected to be completed in 2011 with the issuance of a CUP that will expire in 2013. Cost estimate: \$211,036
- 4. Make improvements to the Lake Groves WWTP headworks, with completion estimated by 6/30/12. The purpose it to reduce head conditions on lift station pumps to improve pumping efficiency. Cost estimate: \$60,000
- 5. Design, permit and construct the Oranges-to-Vistas raw water line. Estimated completion is by 6/30/12. This will provide additional permitted water capacity to meet FDEP regulations. Cost estimate: \$250,000
- 6. Design and install a SCADA system to monitor and manage water supply, distribution, and wastewater collection facilities, to be complete by 6/30/12. The SCADA system will allow for the optimum use of various water supply wells to meet demand without being out of compliance with FDEP treatment and storage regulations. Cost estimate: \$500,000
- 7. Alternative water supply planning necessary to meet Special Conditions mandated by SJRWMD in the LUSI CUP. This is a multi-phase effort with Phase 1 completed by 6/30/12. Cost estimate: \$100,000

Pursuant to Section 367.081(8), Florida Statutes, the Company requests that the Commission process this petition for rate relief using the proposed agency action procedure. The Company also will request interim rates based on the historic test year.
