PROGRESS ENERGY FLORIDA, INC.'S MOTION TO ESTABLISH CASE SCHEDULING ORDER

- On October 8, 2010, Progress Energy Florida, Inc. ("PEF" or the "Company"), filed a motion to establish this docket, and the Commission granted that motion on October 25, 2010.
- In its motion to establish this docket, PEF requested that the Commission establish a case schedule as follows:

January 11, 2011	PEF files petition and direct testimony
May 1, 2011	Intervener testimony
June 1, 2011	Staff testimony
July 1, 2011	Rebuttal testimony
August, 2011	CR3 hearing

At the time PEF made this request, PEF expected that CR3 would return to service near the end of 2010.

3. Subsequent to filing the motion to establish this docket, the Company completed concrete replacement at CR3 and is currently completing the extensive computer modeling necessary to finish the remaining repair work at the plant. The Company is now making preparation for pre-start testing and is targeting return to service in the first quarter of 2011.

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- 4. The Company's updated schedule reflects the additional time required to complete computer analysis that is needed to determine the correct sequence to re-tighten a network of hundreds of horizontal and vertical tendons that provide structural integrity inside the walls of the concrete-and-steel containment building. The repair schedule and return-to-service date, however, are affected by a number of factors, including regulatory reviews by the NRC and other agencies as appropriate, emergent work, engineering designs, computerized modeling, testing, weather and other developments.
- Given these facts, PEF respectfully requests that the Commission set the following case schedule as follows:

60 days after return to service	PEF files petition and direct testimony
180 days after return to service	Intervener testimony
210 days after return to service	Staff testimony
240 days after return to service	Rebuttal testimony
270 days after return to service	CR3 hearing

This proposed schedule will allow all parties the same amount of time for filing testimony as PEF proposed in its motion to establish this docket and will accommodate the fact that the precise return to service date for CR3 is unknown. This proposal will also allow parties and Staff to continue to take discovery in this docket prior to unit restart which should help lessen the need for discovery once direct testimony is filed.

6. Pursuant to Rule 28-106.204(3), F.A.C., PEF has polled the parties to this docket and represents that the Office of Public Counsel does not object to this motion. PEF has not yet heard back from FIPUG as to whether or not FIPUG objects to this motion.

WHEREFORE, PEF requests this Commission to grant this motion and enter an Order

Establishing Procedure with a schedule that is substantially the same as shown above.
