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PROCEEDINGS

MS. GERVASI: We'll go ahead and call this workshop to order.

This time and place has been noticed for an undocketed staff rule development workshop on the initiation of rulemaking to amend Rule 25-4.034, F.A.C., to add new Rule 25-4.0341, and to repeal Rule 25-24.825 relating to the filing of published service schedules and/or tariffs.

There are extra copies of the agenda and the draft rule at the table where the mikes are, if anybody needs one. And before we begin with the staff overview of the draft rule, I would like to, again, remind everybody that we do have a court reporter here. So when you do speak, or when you are called upon to give commentary, please do speak directly into the mike and identify yourself first before you begin speaking.

Do we have anybody on the telephone? MR. O'ROARK: Yes. This is De O'Roark with Verizon.

Okay. After we give a staff overview,

we'll take the commentary of those who are present in the room, and then we will ask anybody on the telephone if they'd like to give any comments after those who are here have spoken.

With that -- one other thing I want to remind everybody is that when you give your comments, please refer us to the specific page and line numbers of the language that you are referring to. And if you have suggested changes, it is very helpful to us if you could give us the specific language that you would suggest that we consider. And with that, I'll turn it over to Jeff Bates for a staff overview.

MR. BATES: Good afternoon. Thank you for joining us for the second half of staff's workshops to amend telecom rules.

This afternoon we're addressing, as

Rosanne pointed out, Rules 25-4.034, 25-4.0341, and

25-24.825. Specifically, Rule 25-4.034 has been

amended to address only network access services

pursuant to the requirements of Section 364.163, and
these changes also incorporate the option for ILECs

to file their tariffs through either hard copy format or electronically. Then it also reduces the number of copies required when filing via hard copy.

New Rule 25-4.0341 is for the filing of service schedules for companies who, though not required to file service schedules, may wish to file service schedules. This would be inclusive of any company like a CLEC, or perhaps an ILEC who wishes to maintain the general services tariff.

And then, finally, Rule 25-24.825, price list, has been completely repealed. There are no further requirements for CLECs to file price lists. And with that, that is my overview. If you have some specific questions related to these, or if you would like me to go over them one-by-one, please let me know.

MS. GERVASI: Does anyone have any comments, kind of an overview type commentary, or would you prefer we go section-by-section?

MR. HATCH: I have no comments.

MR. FEIL: I just had a question, but we can do that as we go through section-by-section. I didn't have any overview comments.

MS. GERVASI: Thank you.

MR. KONUCH: This is Dave Konuch from

Florida Cable. I would prefer that we go 1 section-by-section. 2 MS. GERVASI: Okay. Let's go ahead and do 3 that, then. 4 MR. BATES: All right. Rule 25-4.034 has 5 been updated to change the title of this section to 6 network access tariffs. In addition, we added the 7 reference to the Florida Statutes, and this is a 8 9 change from the original rule. In addition to that 10 change, we have made changes to this such that it 11 only is related to network access tariffs. are no general services tariffs or anything of that 12 13 nature involved at this point. 14 MR. FEIL: Jeff, this is Matt. That 15 applies only to ILECs under present law, because 16 354.163 only governs ILECs --17 MR. BATES: That is correct. 18 MR. FEIL: All right. Thank you. 19 MR. BATES: That is correct. In addition 20 to --21 MS. GERVASI: You're still on .034? 22 MR. BATES: Yes. 23 MS. GERVASI: Okay. 24 MR. BATES: Also in 25-4.034 we've added language to allow the ILECs to file their tariffs, 25

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network access tariffs electronically, and we have included a website address for that purpose, as well as we reduced the number of copies that we require if you do file via hard copy. If companies want to receive an acknowledgment receipt from the Commission related to any hard-copy filing they may make, just include an additional copy of the transmittal letter and a self-addressed stamped envelope and that will be posted after it has been logged into our tariff sections.

And the network access tariffs only comply with conventions that we have kept pretty much standard for the last 20 years, and that's with regard to just formatting of the page for consistency purposes. I don't foresee anybody making massive changes to any of their tariffs. So this should probably have no effect for most of you. And that is pretty much all that I have done for 25-4.034. We have pared it down to give the companies as much leeway as necessary for them to file either electronically or via hard copy. If you have any questions or suggestions, I'd be happy to help.

MS. FEHRMAN: This is Karen from TDS. Do you have to file any kind of election of what you

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want to do, whether it's doing tariffs via the electronic system or hard copy, or is it just up to us to decide that?

MR. BATES: It would be helpful if you filed a notice, but contacting me directly, we'll help you -- we can get that process moving forward.

MS. FEHRMAN: Okay, great. Thanks.

MS. GERVASI: Does anyone else who is present in the room have any questions or comments to make to the suggested changes to 25-4.034?

How about anybody on the telephone?

Then I guess we are ready to move on to
.0341.

MR. BATES: Okay. New Rule 25-4.0341, filling of service schedules. We developed this rule because after July 1st we found a number of CLECs, competitive companies wishing to continue to file their price lists or service schedules with the Commission, and this was the easiest way to accommodate that, because it sets it separately from the provision that was changed pursuant to Chapter 364.163. Other than that, it's basically the pared-down bare-bones version of making a filing. It can be done either electronically or via hard copy. The same process is involved with the network

access services filed by the ILECs.

Are there any questions?

MR. KONUCH: This is Dave Konuch from Florida Cable. Suppose you have a price list on file, what happens to it? Do you have to refile it under this new service schedule rule.

MR. BATES: No.

MR. KONUCH: And I guess as a follow-up to that, what is the legal effect that you envision for the price lists that are already on file? Does the PSC -- does it consider them as anything, I guess, effectively if you still want to have -- even though you're not required to have a price list, if you still want the Commission to have kind of official notice of it, do you have to -- of your price list, do you have to do anything, or would you anticipate that we would file a service schedule?

MR. BATES: I don't foresee anything, but Greg may have a perspective on that that I haven't thought of.

MR. SHAFER: If you currently have a price list on file, and you prospectively anticipate continuing to maintain that price list, then I don't think there is any action necessary. If you have one on file, but you're going to subsequently rely

on published -- for example, on a website, it would be helpful for us to know so that we could cancel the existing price list that we have on file. But other than that, I mean, I don't anticipate that you would have to refile anything in order to continue to maintain what you have on file here. And Rosanne can correct me if that's not correct.

MS. GERVASI: I don't know of any corrections to that. I think the goal is for us to have what it is that you all are going to be sharing with the customers and relying on. So whether that's what you already have on file or if you need to make changes, then, you know, we just want the current information.

MR. FEIL: This is Matt Feil. I'm here for TW Telecom, by the way. I had two questions about .0341. The first one was with respect to electronic filing. I don't know that many, if any, CLECs have done that heretofore, but I'm assuming I can go to this http reference, and it will give anybody who wants to file electronically instructions on where to send it, how to send it, and so forth, is that correct?

MR. BATES: It is about 50 percent correct.

MR. FEIL: Okay.

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MR. BATES: We don't have everything there for security reasons, specifically, our e-mail address for that purpose. But what is there at that page currently deals with all of telecom, and the portion that deals with electronic filing of tariffs has got to be up updated to take into account rule changes as a result of this workshop.

MR. FEIL: Understood. Thank you.

The second question was right now CLECs have a separate section of 25-24, or what I call the 800 series of rules. And since this new rule is in 25-4 and will govern CLEC service schedules, I was just curious to know whether or not the 800 series is going to be removed, updated, if the 800 series will now cross-reference this rule, or -- I know that's outside the scope of the workshop, but I just wanted to get some indication from y'all, if you knew.

MR. SHAFER: I believe the goal is to merge the two. And I don't want to speak about what I don't know about, but --

MR. FEIL: Ultimately if that is the direction we are heading. That's all I was looking for.

MS. SALAK: That is the direction we are 1 heading. 2 MR. FEIL: Thank you. Those were the only 3 questions I had. MR. BATES: Anyone else? 5 This is Karen from TDS. On MS. FEHRMAN: 6 the 25-4.0341, Line 9, it's the letter of 7 transmittal showing a company's filing. Do you need 8 a different transmittal number with each filing? 9 MR. BATES: No. Transmittal numbers, in 10 my experience, have been used by the companies 11 themselves for their own internal tracking. Staff 12 assigns a tariff filing number. It's a series of 13 numbers we have assigned over the last 30 or 40 14 years to each filing that comes in. We don't 15 suspect that will change any. But as far as your 16 internal documentation and how you track your 17 transmittals, that is completely within the scope of 18 the company. 19 MS. FEHRMAN: Okay, great. Thanks. 20 MR. BATES: Anyone else on the telephone 21 that would like to make comments? Okay. 22 MR. KONUCH: I have one additional 23 question in the room. Dave Konuch, again, at 24 Florida Cable. On Page 5 where you are streamlining 25

the access tariff rule, it deletes the requirement that there be maps defining exchange service areas. What was the purpose behind deleting that requirement?

MR. BATES: The statutory requirement no longer has the maps. Our intent in writing this was to match the statute, the authority given in the statute to the best of our ability. And many of the things that we have taken out were a result of us reviewing that statute and making sure that our rules themselves didn't go beyond the scope of the statute.

Anyone else? Harvey, I haven't heard you offer a rule that you didn't like.

MR. BATES: No.

MS. GERVASI: Does anybody else have any questions or comments to any of the rules? We didn't talk about price lists, but that one is just being proposed for repeal, that being 25-24.825. Anybody on the telephone have anything else they'd like to add? Okay.

Seeing nothing. Before we adjourn, we would like to give you all an opportunity to file

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post-workshop comments, and we would propose a 1 two-week turnaround time for that, if that is 2 3 amendable. That would make the post-workshop comments due on Monday, December the 19th. Is that workable? 5 6 MR. KONUCH: To the extent some of us are 7 filing this set of comments and possibly the ones from this morning's workshop, could you make these 8 9 due maybe a couple of days later, say on the 10 Wednesday, the -- I quess the 21st? 11 MS. GERVASI: That's fine with staff. can make the post-workshop comments due on the 21st, 12 December 21st. 13 14 Thank you all for your participation 15 today.
