

Date of Planned Service Discontinuance (47 C.F.R. § 63.71(a)(2), (b)(2)):

AT&T will no longer offer these services to new customers on or after May 31, 2012, subject to Commission approval of this application. Existing customers may retain their services in accordance with the terms and conditions of their existing contracts. Upon expiration of existing contracts, AT&T will continue to provide these services to existing customers on a month-to-month basis until such time as AT&T discontinues these services, which is currently planned for April 30, 2016.

Points of Geographic Areas of Service Affected (47 C.F.R. § 63.71(a)(3), b(2)):

These services will be discontinued throughout the United States, including Alaska, Hawaii, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico and the U.S. Virgin Islands.

Brief Description of Type of Service Affected (47 C.F.R. § 63.71(a)(3), b(2)):

AT&T, AT&T Alaska and VTNS Frame Relay service:

Frame Relay Service is a public, metropolitan and wide-area data service. It utilizes packet switching technology and digital transmission facilities to provide a data delivery service.

AT&T and AT&T Alaska Asynchronous Transfer Mode service:

Asynchronous Transfer Mode (ATM) Service is a high speed switched transport service that combines disparate applications, from separate locations, using a common network access device and physical network connection.

AT&T is discontinuing these services as a result of declining market demand. The market is moving to next generation technologies, which provide higher bandwidths and a wider range of applications. These services have been replaced in the market by multi-protocol label switching (MPLS) network-based VPN services, which are offered by AT&T and other service

providers. Consequently, the public convenience and necessity should not be impaired by this discontinuance.

Brief Description of the Dates and Methods of Notice to All Affected Customers (47 C.F.R.

§63.71(b)(3)):

AT&T notified its customers of its intention to discontinue this service by letter sent via U.S. Mail on April 13, 2012. A copy of the customer notification is attached hereto as Attachment A.

In addition, copies of this Application are being sent, first class U.S. Mail, to the public utilities commission and governor of each state in which discontinuance is proposed and also to the Special Assistant for Telecommunications to the Secretary of Defense, as required by 63.71(a) of the Commission's rules.

Regulatory Classification of Carrier (47 C.F.R. § 63.71(b)(4)):

AT&T offers AT&T FR and ATM services pursuant to non-dominant carrier regulation.

Effective on May 31, 2012, pending regulatory approval, all AT&T Packet Services (including all Domestic and International Frame Relay and ATM services) provided under the AT&T Packet Services' Service Guide and various integrated offer service guides (such as ABN, OneNet and VTNS), located at <http://serviceguidenew.att.com>, and under any state tariffs, service guides or other applicable Service Publications, will no longer be available to new customers in the United States, including Alaska, Hawaii, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, the U.S. Virgin Islands, or any other country. These services include, but are not limited to:

- AT&T Frame Relay Service (FRS)
- AT&T Asynchronous Transfer Mode (ATM) Service
- AT&T Alaska Frame Relay Service
- AT&T Alaska Asynchronous Transfer Mode (ATM) Service
- VTNS Frame Relay Service.

As a current AT&T customer with AT&T Packet Services, you may retain your existing service(s), and may continue to conduct moves, adds and changes until March 30, 2015.

For customers with AT&T Packet Services with unexpired contracts (other than integrated contract offers, such as VTNS, OneNet, ABN, etc.), AT&T will allow one extension of their existing contract past its current term for 12 months, provided (i) the extension is signed on or before December 31, 2012, and the extended term expires no later than December 31, 2013, and (ii) the rates for the services during such extension period will be at rates to be determined on an individual case basis. Integrated contract offers may be subject to renewal or extension in accordance with AT&T's standard practices and procedures relating to such contracts, but such contracts may include restrictions or limitations applicable to the AT&T Packet Services being discontinued. Other than as set forth above, no renewals, extensions or new term plans may be entered into after May 31, 2012. Upon expiration of a customer's contract, AT&T will continue to provide the service on a month-to-month basis until the service is discontinued (currently planned for April 30, 2016).
