20	Joe Natural Gas and Peoples Gas System have been
21	excused from the prehearing and the parties are
22	proposing stipulation on all issues. And OPC has taken
23	no position on the issues.
24	COMMISSIONER BALBIS: Okay. Are there any
25	other preliminary matters?

MS. ROBINSON: No, none at this time. 1 COMMISSIONER BALBIS: Okay. Similar to the 2 03 docket prehearing conference, we'll go through the 3 draft prehearing order, and we will start with 4 Section I, case background. Any questions or comments 5 on Section I? 6 7 Section II, conduct of proceedings. Section III, jurisdiction. 8 Section XIV, procedure for handling 9 confidential information. 10 Section V, prefiled testimony. 11 Section VI, order of witnesses. 12 MS. ROBINSON: Staff will note that on Page 4 13 of the draft prehearing order it states that witnesses 14 may be excused if no Commissioner seeks 15 cross-examination. At this point it appears that all 16 witnesses can be excused, but we will confirm with the 17 Commissioners' offices. 18 **COMMISSIONER BALBIS:** Okay. Thank you. 19 Section VII, basic positions. 20 Section VIII, issues and positions. 21 22 MS. ROBINSON: Staff wants to note that the parties and staff are proposing stipulation on all 23 issues, and this is reflected in the draft prehearing 24 25 order.

MS. CHRISTENSEN: And Patty Christensen with 1 the Office of Public Counsel. As previously stated by 2 staff, OPC is changing from no position at this time to 3 no position on all the issues in this section. 4 COMMISSIONER BALBIS: Okay. Thank you. 5 Any other comments on Section VIII? 6 7 Section IX, exhibit list. MS. ROBINSON: Staff will note for the record 8 that a Comprehensive Exhibit list was prepared and 9 distributed to the parties for the purpose of numbering 10 and identifying exhibits at the hearing. 11 COMMISSIONER BALBIS: Okay. Thank you. 12 Section X, proposed stipulations. 13 MS. ROBINSON: There are no proposed 14 stipulations at this time. I'm sorry, we are proposing 15 stipulations on all issues at this time. 16 COMMISSIONER BALBIS: Section XI, pending 17 motions. 18 MS. ROBINSON: There are no pending motions 19 at this time. 20 COMMISSIONER BALBIS: Section XII. 21 22 MS. ROBINSON: There are no pending confidential requests. 23 COMMISSIONER BALBIS: Section XIII, any 24 questions or comments on the post-hearing procedures? 25

16	St. Joe Natural Gas Company and Peoples Gas System were
17	excused from the prehearing.
18	COMMISSIONER BALBIS: Okay. Are there any
19	other matters to address?
20	MS. ROBINSON: There are no other matters at
21	this time.
22	COMMISSIONER BALBIS: Okay. Then this
