

On October 25, 2012, Embarq Florida, Inc. (CenturyLink) filed a request for additional numbering resources from the Number Pooling Administrator (NeuStar) for the Kissimmee exchange (KSSMFLXAPS0) wire center. CenturyLink requested a 407-NXX-2, 3, 4, 5, 6, or 7 to meet the request of a specific customer for 1,000 consecutive numbers. On October 25, 2012, its request for additional numbering resources was denied because it did not meet the utilization criteria.

On October 26, 2012, CenturyLink filed a petition requesting that the Commission overturn NeuStar's decision. In accordance with Section 2.07C.5.e of the Administrative Procedures Manual (APM), staff has examined the CenturyLink petition and has determined the following:

- 1) The carrier has demonstrated that it has customers in need of numbering resources;
- 2) The carrier has shown that it will be unable to provide services to these potential customers because of NeuStar's denial of the numbering resources; and
- 3) Customers will not be able to obtain service from the provider of his/her choice because the carrier does not have the numbers available.

Since the three criteria of Section 2.07C.5.e of the APM have been met, please prepare an administrative Proposed Agency Action Order to be issued within seven business days of this memorandum (November 13, 2012), as outlined in the APM expedited code denial process. NeuStar should be directed to provide CenturyLink the needed numbering resources to meet its customer's needs in the Kissimmee exchange (KSSMFLXAPS0).
