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PROCEEDINGS 1 CHAIRMAN BRISÉ: Okay. Moving on to Item 2 Number 2. 3 MR. SMALLAKOFF: Well, it's not. CHAIRMAN BRISÉ: Item Number 2. 5 MS. CRAWFORD: Commissioners, I'm Jennifer 6 7 Crawford for legal staff. Item 2 addresses the complaint by Mr. 8 Smallakoff against Florida -- excuse me, Progress 9 Energy Florida concerning alleged improper bills. 10 Staff has requested permission to make an oral 11 modification to correct two typographical errors in 12 13 the recommendation. CHAIRMAN BRISÉ: Sure. 14 15 MS. CRAWFORD: On Page 5 in the 16 recommendation statement, the amount of \$340 should be corrected to read \$320, and that same correction 17 should be made on the last line of Page 9. 18 As you know, Mr. Smallakoff is on the line 19 to address this item. Representatives of Progress 20 Energy are present to answer any questions you may 21 22 have, as is Commission staff. MR. SMALLAKOFF: Well, I would like to go 23 This is Mr. Smallakoff speaking. I would 24

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like to go back and --

CHAIRMAN BRISÉ: Mr. Smallakoff. 1 Mr. Smallakoff, if you could give me a 2 second? 3 MR. SMALLAKOFF: Yes. CHAIRMAN BRISÉ: Okay. So we can lay down 5 the ground rules again. So you will have five 6 7 minutes, and within your five minutes you can make your comments, and after that you will be placed on 8 mute again. And unless there is a question for you, 9 10 you will not be placed off of mute, okay? MR. SMALLAKOFF: Well, if this is Mr. 11 Brisé --12 CHAIRMAN BRISÉ: Yes, it is. 13 MR. SMALLAKOFF: -- I have to protest. 14 tried to answer the responses made by certain 15 members and so on, and probably by Ms. Brown, in 16 reference to my purported abuse of the system, 17 knowing full well that these utilities are going to 18 do it again and again and again. And I have 19 received no response from anybody regarding this, 20 and it simply slid into this other case with 21 22 Progress Energy. 23

I have more than addressed all of those terrible violations and misconduct and so on in my letter with respect to the FPL, and it was summarily

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dismissed, as to say there were no violations, when I cited theft of mail. If that doesn't constitute a gross violation and an illegal act, I don't know what does.

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And I have received no response to my comments, and now to say that, oh, gee, somebody is abusing the system, and now they have got to get a lawyer before they file a complaint. I know this was directed towards the full knowledge that these utilities will continue to do what they have been doing because I have been targeted, and you are giving them a green light to do it. I would like somebody to comment on that.

COMMISSIONER GRAHAM: Sir, just to let you know that your five minutes is clicking by.

MR. SMALLAKOFF: Oh, so you're not going to -- you're not going to allow me to respond to those comments that are made. And now I wrote a letter also with respect to Progress Energy; the same conditions exist. There has been external interference to generate these monstrous bills. I addressed what was done by Progress Energy and the disconnections and all of that in depth in a letter with respect to Progress Energy's behavior and so on and so forth.

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read nothing. Because to rubber stamp it and to say that there is no violations, that these utilities have done nothing and so on, irrespective of what I have stated in the letter, then this whole thing about the five minutes and so on is nothing short of absurd. And if you want to carry on with this and rubber stamp everything, like the politician said, you're not going to win it. Martha Brown stated in trying to get me to drop the case as far as she is concerned it's settled. The question remains why are we going through this?

You're not giving me an opportunity to answer and respond to some of the comments made by the members and the lawyers and so on. And now you are sliding into the Progress Energy one with the same type of dismissal. So you can do whatever you want, and you are going to, but as far as any kind of fairness and so on with respect to this, I thought the Commission would have respect for the contents of the letters that I have written addressing all of the issues, but apparently not.

CHAIRMAN BRISÉ: Okay. Mr. Smallakoff, is that -- you still have a minute and fifty-six seconds left. So if there are any further comments

that you would like to make, you may make them at this time.

MR. SMALLAKOFF: Well, certainly. As I stated in my letters, and the actual truth of it was, and if these people were under oath they would have to admit it, there was external interference with the interjection of slander, defamation, and character assassination with this targeting process that has been circulated and widespread through the PSC, the utilities, and the legal department. And as an investigator from the Office of Public Counsel stated, these people hate you and they are working against you hand in glove. The man was a long time investigator and he ought to know.

So if this is considered to be fair, nobody is answering my questions and so on, and these five-minute presentations -- they have been more -- these issues have been more than addressed in both letters to the FPL's violations and with Progress Energy's violations. And if you want to disregard them, you will. And as I said, the cases have been predetermined by the individuals that I stated beforehand. So if that is what you want to do, the power exists for you to do it, but this is not the be all and the end all of it. And I have to

protest the patent unfairness of this whole process.

And my questions still weren't answered with respect to abuse of the system and so on and so forth. I don't know who made the comment, but that needs to be responded to.

CHAIRMAN BRISÉ: All right. Thank you very much, Mr. Smallakoff. At this time we are going to place you on mute.

Commissioners, any questions at this point? Okay. And if staff would like to make any comments.

MS. CRAWFORD: (Indicating negatively.)
CHAIRMAN BRISÉ: Okay.

Commissioner Edgar.

COMMISSIONER EDGAR: Thank you, Mr. Chairman.

Briefly, just for the record, I do believe that Mr. Smallakoff has somewhat misrepresented the comments that were made on the previous item. I regret that he is not satisfied with the process, but from my review of the items, my discussion with my staff, and I also would like to say for the record that I have reviewed the two letters that he faxed to us. They are a little difficult to read, but I have reviewed them.

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I know that there is no predetermination or rubber stamp, and I find those comments regrettable, but I do understand and recognize and appreciate the conviction that Mr. Smallakoff has about these issues. However, from the review of the information, I do not believe that there is further action that this Commission can or should take that would be to his satisfaction or within our authority, and so I will move that we approve the staff recommendation on Item 2.

CHAIRMAN BRISÉ: Okay. It has been moved and seconded.

Commissioner Balbis.

COMMISSIONER BALBIS: Thank you, Mr. Chairman.

And thank you, Commissioner Edgar. I fully support the motion and also the comments that you have made. And as with the previous item, you know, I'd just like to point out the work that has been done not only by Progress but also by our staff in response to Mr. Smallakoff's complaint.

There have been multiple tests on his meter that were performed, not once, not twice, but over three times, and the last of which was witnessed by PSC staff at Progress Energy's

facilities at great expense, but it's something --1 we do take customer complaints seriously. On top of 2 that, there was a detailed account audit that was 3 performed detailing all the correspondence and all 4 the account activity for this account. 5 So I believe that we have made a thorough 6 7 investigation of this complaint, and I, too, do not appreciate comments such as rubber-stamping, 8 9 especially looking at the level of effort that our staff and Progress and now us, as Commissioners, 10 have gone through. So with that I fully support the 11 motion. 12 CHAIRMAN BRISÉ: Okay. Thank you very 13 much, Commissioner Balbis. 14 Any further comments? 15 Okay. All in favor say aye. 16 (Vote taken.) 17 CHAIRMAN BRISÉ: All right. Thank you 18 very much. And, Mr. Smallakoff, thank you for your 19 participation, once again. 20 21 22 23 24 25
