**REVISED PETITION FOR APPROVAL OF GPIF RESULTS FOR THE
PERIOD JANUARY 2012 THROUGH DECEMBER 2012**

Florida Power & Light Company ("FPL") hereby files this revised petition for approval of a Generating Performance Incentive Factor ("GPIF") reward of \$20,679,970 for the period January 2012 through December 2012. In support of this Petition, FPL states as follows:

1. By Order No. PSC-11-0579-FOF-EI dated December 16, 2011, the Commission approved GPIF Targets for FPL for the period January 2012 through December 2012. The application of the GPIF formula to FPL's performance during that period produces a reward of \$20,679,970. The calculation of FPL's GPIF reward is discussed and supported in the revised prepared testimony and exhibits of FPL witness J. Carine Bullock, which are being filed with and incorporated in this Petition.

2. Additionally, witness Bullock explains adjustments that FPL proposes to the Heat Rates, Net Output Factors and Forced Outage Factors of St. Lucie 1, St. Lucie 2 and Turkey Point 3 to address the impact on their operation resulting from the Extended Power Uprates (EPU). The effect of the proposed adjustments is to reduce the 2012 GPIF reward. This reduction is reflected in the reward of \$20,679,970 for which FPL seeks approval.

3. On March 15, 2013, FPL petitioned for a GPIF reward of \$22,045,401 for the period January 2012 through December 2012. Subsequent to that filing, FPL discovered that the generation output for the Martin Solar facility during the months of January 2012 through May 2012 had been omitted from its Form 1192 system. When the solar generation for those months was added, the total generation output from the Martin Solar facility increased from 49,946

MWh to 88,734 MWh. Solar generation is subtracted from the total output of Martin Unit 8 for the purpose of calculating the actual ANOHR for that unit. Subtracting the larger total solar generation resulted in increasing the Martin Unit 8 ANOHR from 6,982 Btu/kWh to 7,021 Btu/kWh. In turn, this increase in the heat rate reduced the Martin Unit 8 ANOHR reward from \$2,417,796 to \$1,052,356 and the total GPIF reward from \$22,045,401 to \$20,679,970. The total potential fuel savings were correspondingly reduced from \$49,043,472 to \$46,363,302. Ms. Bullock's revised prepared testimony and petition reflect these corrections.

WHEREFORE, Florida Power & Light Company respectfully requests the Commission to approve \$20,679,970 as FPL's GPIF reward for the period January 2012 through December 2012 and include this amount in the calculation of the Fuel Cost Recovery Factor for the period beginning January 2014.

**FLORIDA POWER & LIGHT COMPANY’S MOTION FOR LEAVE TO FILE
REVISED PETITION FOR APPROVAL OF GPIF RESULTS FOR THE
PERIOD JANUARY 2012 THROUGH DECEMBER 2012,
AND REVISED TESTIMONY AND EXHIBITS
OF J. CARINE BULLOCK**

Florida Power & Light Company (“FPL”), pursuant to Rule 28-106.204, F.A.C., hereby moves for leave to file the attached Revised Petition for Approval of GPIF Results for the Period January 2012 Through December 2012 (the “Revised Petition”) and revised direct testimony and exhibits of J. Carine Bullock (the “Revised Testimony”). In support of its motion, FPL states as follows:

1. On March 15, 2013, FPL petitioned for a GPIF reward of \$22,045,401 for the period January 2012 through December 2012. Subsequent to that filing, FPL discovered that the generation output for the Martin Solar facility during the months of January 2012 through May 2012 had been omitted from its Form 1192 system. When the solar generation for those months was added, the total generation output from the Martin Solar facility increased from 49,946 MWh to 88,734 MWh. Solar generation is subtracted from the total output of Martin Unit 8 for the purpose of calculating the actual ANOHR for that unit. Subtracting the larger total solar generation resulted in increasing the Martin Unit 8 ANOHR from 6,982 Btu/kWh to 7,021 Btu/kWh. In turn, this increase in the heat rate reduced the Martin Unit 8 ANOHR reward from

\$2,417,796 to \$1,052,356 and the total GPIF reward from \$22,045,401 to \$20,679,970. The total potential fuel savings were correspondingly reduced from \$49,043,472 to \$46,363,302.

2. For ease of reference, FPL has prepared the Revised Petition and Revised Testimony as stand-alone documents that completely replace their March 15 counterparts, rather than as revisions to those earlier documents.

3. FPL has contacted counsel for all other parties of record concerning this motion. None has stated an objection to the motion.

WHEREFORE, FPL moves the Commission for leave to file the attached Revised Petition for Approval of GPIF Results for the Period January 2012 Through December 2012 and revised direct testimony and exhibits of J. Carine Bullock.
