## PROCEEDINGS

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CHAIRMAN BRISÉ: So now we are moving on to number 9, Gulf Power.

MR. GRAVES: Good afternoon, Commissioners.

Robert Graves with Commission staff.

Item 9 addresses a petition by Gulf Power
Company requesting a Commission order approving the
recovery of costs associated with three projects. Two
of the projects which involve transmission upgrades have
since been consolidated with the company's current rate
case. Therefore, staff's recommendation in this docket
only considers the company's request for an order
approving the addition of a bromine and activated carbon
injection project on Plant Daniel Units 1 and 2.

The proposed project, which is scheduled to be placed in service prior to 2016, will allow the plant, the plants to meet the requirements of the Mercury and Air Toxics Standards rule. Staff recommends that the project is required for compliance with governmentally imposed environmental regulation, and the prudently incurred costs should be eligible for recovery through the environmental cost recovery clause. Staff, as well as members of the company, are here for questions that you may have.

CHAIRMAN BRISÉ: Thank you very much.

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Mr. Stone.

MR. STONE: Chairman Brisé, we are here to -we are here in support of the staff recommendation and
to answer any questions the Commission may have.

CHAIRMAN BRISÉ: All right. Thank you.

Commissioners, questions.

Commissioner Graham.

COMMISSIONER GRAHAM: Thank you, Mr. Chair. I pulled this pretty much just for one reason. I just -- to get a better understanding, when you're injecting the activated carbon into the flue gas, what is the by-product of, of that reaction?

MR. STONE: There will be a minimal increase in the amount of ash that is, that is collected from the precipitator. And the ash that is collected from the precipitator after ACI injection is of a slightly different composition than fly ash without ACI. In either case, at Plant Daniel the ash that's collected through the precipitator is disposed of in an onsite landfill. And in the injection of ACI, particularly in the case where we have bromine injection as well, the minimal amount of additional fly ash collection can be disposed of through the existing landfill system.

COMMISSIONER GRAHAM: You say minimum. What's your definition of minimum? What are we talking?

MR. STONE: Less than 1% additional.

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COMMISSIONER GRAHAM: Okay. That's all I had.

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COMMISSIONER BALBIS: Thank you. I just

CHAIRMAN BRISÉ: Commissioner Balbis.

wanted to make a brief comment. And I don't know who to thank for separating this out, but I think that it's definitely appropriate that those transmission projects be included in their rate case. So I think this makes it easier for us and I'm in full support of staff's recommendation.

CHAIRMAN BRISÉ: All right.

Commissioner Brown.

COMMISSIONER BROWN: I think that would be the Prehearing Officer.

But I just have a question. I know that the Plant Daniel scrubbers were approved for cost recovery in 2010 and are expected to be completed in 2015. What, what's the current status? I thought originally it was 2014.

MR. STONE: Commissioner, they are currently on schedule for 2015. They've been -- the schedule has moved around a little bit, and it was largely as a measure of the other activities at the plant that had to be taken care of. So I think, I think we're still on schedule for 2015 in service for those scrubbers.

COMMISSIONER BROWN: Okay. With that, I 1 2 support the motion. CHAIRMAN BRISÉ: Commissioner Edgar. 3 COMMISSIONER EDGAR: Thank you, Mr. Chairman. 4 I was just briefly going to comment that, and 5 point out that this item is merely for eligibility 6 7 through the ECRC, that we are not approving any costs today, but that will be part of a future proceeding. 8 9 And from my perspective, these projects are right in keeping with what I think the intent of the ECRC process 10 is and I move staff recommendation. 11 12 COMMISSIONER GRAHAM: Second. CHAIRMAN BRISÉ: Okay. It's been moved and 13 14 seconded. Any further discussion? Commissioner Balbis. 15 COMMISSIONER BALBIS: Yes. Thank you. And 16 17 thank you, Commissioner Brown, for pointing out who I need to thank, and I would like to thank Commissioner 18 Edgar as the Prehearing Officer for separating this out. 19 CHAIRMAN BRISÉ: All right. It's been moved 2.0 21 and seconded. Any additional discussion? All right. 22 Seeing none, all in favor, say aye. 23 (Vote taken.) 24 All right. Thank you very much. 25 (Agenda item concluded.)
