I am a resident of Florida living at 700 Beach Road, Unit 252 in Indian River Shores, Florida.

It is unbelievable that the electrical service for a small town like Indian River Shores is divided between two electrical suppliers, Vero Beach and FPL. Those of us living on the side of town serviced by Vero Beach are getting a really raw deal. Our rates are considerably higher and our service is worse than those provided by FPL. We are effectively being

taxed by Vero Beach without representation. We are not being represented by state funded legal counsel charged with protecting us against excessive rates and poor service.

The electrical franchise agreement between Indian River Shores and Vero Beach expires this November. In view of this change in legal circumstances, please vote to have all of Indian River Shores electrical power provided by FPL to solve these problems. It is only fair.
