Dear Commissioner

As resident of Indian River Shores, I am writing to urge you to treat Indian River Shores' complaint favorably by agreeing that a "changed legal circumstance" has occurred and to grant the town's request for a change in territorial boundaries. As you know, one of the Commission's goals is to provide a "regulatory process that results in fair and reasonable rates while offering rate base regulated utilities an opportunity to earn a fair return on their investment - clearly the City of Vero Beach's return is in excess of a fair return, but because the City of Vero Beach is a municipal utility, it is able to get away with charging unfair rates without regard to a return on investment or appropriate oversight. Moreover, the Commission should, in accordance with its mission, "provide appropriate regulatory oversight to protect consumers" of Indian River Shores. Again, I urge you to protect the consumers of Indian River Shores and allow Florida Power and Light to serve our needs.
