Please refer to Florida Power & Light Company's (FPL or Company) "Mid-Course Correction Petition" (MCC Petition), dated February 26, 2021, filed in Docket No. 20210001-EI. The Company's supporting documentation filed with its MCC petition assumes an April 1, 2021 implementation date for new rates. However, the Florida Public Service Commission (Commission) Conference addressing the Company's petition is also contemplated to be April 1, 2021. Hypothetically, if the Company's petition is addressed at the April 1, 2021 Commission Conference, but ultimately the Commission decides on an alternative effective date of May 1, 2021, or alternative recovery amounts (detailed below), what would be the Company's factors?
