I just figured it out and I have a big whopping amount of \$45.00 to play with this month. Did you think savings? Well, that amounts to a low, low double digit figure. And, how long is that going to last? Presently I have a secondary insurance and am thinking that I may have to cancel that "down the road". And the above will be raising their rates. I have trouble trying to think about not paying my bills.(I have a very good credit rating by the way,) averaging around 800. And I would like to try to keep it that way.
