Hello,

I am writing because I was very frustrated to learn that the Florida Public Service Commission approved a minimum \$25 bill for FPL to charge customers. I am a 100% self-sufficient solar home, and I was paying a \$8.99 grid connection fee for emergencies and to sell my excess power back to the grid for usage around the state. So far this year we have "sold" 1.41MWh back to the FPL to be used in the state of Florida and have not received any payment, it feels as though now we are just going to be paying to donate energy back to FPL. Nearly tripling the cost of connection seems excessive.

Is this a trend we can expect to see continue? What are we doing to incentivize our state to go green if now we have to pay to convert to solar and then pay to share our energy?

I am disappointed and frustrated at the decision that was made.
