Issue 1: Should the application for a wastewater certificate by SGI Wastewater Services, Inc. be approved? **Recommendation:** Yes. SGI should be granted Certificate No. 580-S to serve the territory described in Attachment A of staff's recommendation dated June 24, 2022, effective the date of the Commission's vote. The resultant order should serve as SGI's wastewater certificate and it should be retained by the Utility. SGI's existing rates, late payment charge, and initial customer deposits, shown on Schedule No. 1 of staff's recommendation dated June 24, 2022, should remain in effect until a change is authorized by the Commission in a subsequent proceeding.

Issue 2: Should SGI Wastewater Services, Inc.'s miscellaneous service charges be revised to conform to amended Rule 25-30.460, F.A.C.?

Recommendation: Yes. The miscellaneous service charges should be revised to conform to the recent amendment to Rule 25-30.460, F.A.C. The tariff should be revised to reflect the removal of initial connection and normal reconnection charges. SGI should be required to file a proposed customer notice to reflect the Commission-approved charges. The approved charges should be effective on or after the stamped approval date on the tariff sheet pursuant to Rule 25-30.475(1), F.A.C. In addition, the approved charges should not be implemented until staff has approved the proposed customer notice and the notice has been received by customers. The Utility should provide proof of the date notice was given within 10 days of the date of the notice. SGI should be required to charge the approved miscellaneous service charges until authorized to charge them by the Commission in a subsequent proceeding.

Issue 3: Should this docket be closed?

Recommendation: Yes. If no person whose substantial interests are affected by the proposed agency action files a protest within 21 days of the issuance of the order, a consummating order should be issued. The docket should remain open for staff's verification that the revised tariff sheets and customer notice have been filed by the Utility and approved by staff. Once these actions are complete, this docket should be closed administratively.
