- >> We own a condo on Palm Island Resort. We know the resort is in favor of having city sewer connected to the resort.
- >> In the years that we have visited and now have owned, we have seen an increase in the number of homes and visitors. This number jumped greatly during Covid. At one point I heard there were over 90 remodels or new builds on previously empty lots. Many empty lots on the resort sold including the ones that are closest to Stump Pass. This will greatly increase the number of septic systems on the island and to our sewer system more.
- >> In addition, we have noticed a huge change in sea grass in rum bay. Where once there were beautiful grass flats, they are now covered in macro algae choking off the grass and eliminating its ability to filter the impurities and feed the sea life. Last week there was an abundance of floating bright green algae.
- >> If we are serious about protecting our coastlines, we have to move toward a sewer system.
