In the years that we have visited and now have owned, we have seen an increase in the number of homes and visitors. This number jumped greatly during Covid. At one point I heard there were over 90 remodels or new builds on previously empty lots. Many empty lots on the resort sold including the ones that are closest to Stump Pass.
